

Information Sharing Principles Pavilion Indian Band Treaty Negotiations

In accordance with the British Columbia Treaty Commission readiness criteria (3) (b), the Pavilion Indian band, British Columbia and Canada agree on how to share information with each other. Information sharing will facilitate negotiations and build trust between the three parties to the negotiators. The Pavilion Indian Band, British Columbia and Canada (the "Parties") agree to the following information principles:

1. To create a common information base for use by all three Parties to the Negotiators.
2. To establish an effective and cost-sharing approach, which will include methods to prioritise information needs in order to account for human and fiscal limitations.
3. When new information needs are identified the Parties must agree on what information is necessary, when and how to obtain that information.
4. To establish clear criteria and procedures for access to information and to avoid use of formal access to information processes.
5. To maintain reliable, accurate information, which included sharing revisions of information already shared between the Parties.

Note: In order to implement these principles it is recognised that mechanisms on information sharing, including those dealing with cost sharing, need to be developed.
