BENEFITS OF AIP

- Provides certainty over Tsawwassen First Nation's aboriginal rights related to land and resources
- Attracts investment and strengthens local, regional economies
- Lays foundation for co-operative local government relations
- Materially improves the lives of First Nations

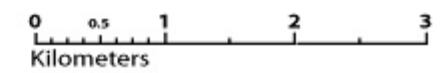

ELEMENTS OF AIP

- AIP provides for negotiation of two separate agreements
 - **Final agreement (constitutionally protected)**
 - **Governance agreement (not constitutionally entrenched)**
- Law-making authorities related to land and resource rights
- \$10.1 million capital transfer and other funds

B.C.'S NEGOTIATING PRINCIPLES

- **No land expropriations**
- **Leases and licences respected**
- **Public access for hunting, fishing, recreation ensured**
- **Parks and protected areas maintained**
- **Provincial standards apply for resource management and environmental protection**
- **Comparable authorities in areas of similar jurisdiction to local governments**
- **Harmonized approach for land use planning**
- **Tax exemptions phased out**

RECOMMENDED DECISIONS

- **Approve Agreement-in-Principle**
- **Approve proceeding to Final Agreement negotiations**
