



If you agree to meet with someone from the Public Guardian and Trustee Woodlands Project Team

- ii The letter you received from the Woodlands Project Team offered you the chance to meet with someone from the Public Guardian and Trustee. If you have a committee or representative, the meeting will be organized through that person. The meeting will take about one hour.

- ii What you can do:
 - o You can choose the location of the meeting so that it is convenient to you and private.
 - o You can have a support person with you that you trust and who will respect your privacy.
 - o You can ask questions about the McCallum Report on Woodlands and about the Public Guardian and Trustee.
 - o You can stop the interview at any point.

- ii What the person from the Public Guardian and Trustee will do:
 - o Tell you what records the Public Guardian and Trustee received from the Dulcie McCallum report about your time in Woodlands.
 - o Ask you if you want to talk about Woodlands.
 - o Advise you of your options if you want to respond to this information.
 - o Tell you about options to get more information, e.g. Freedom of Information requests.
 - o Answer your questions.

- ii After the interview:
 - o You will be given an information package about the Public Guardian and Trustee and the Woodlands Project.
 - o You will be invited to phone or write to the person who met with you or any other person at the Public Guardian and Trustee's office who can answer your questions.
