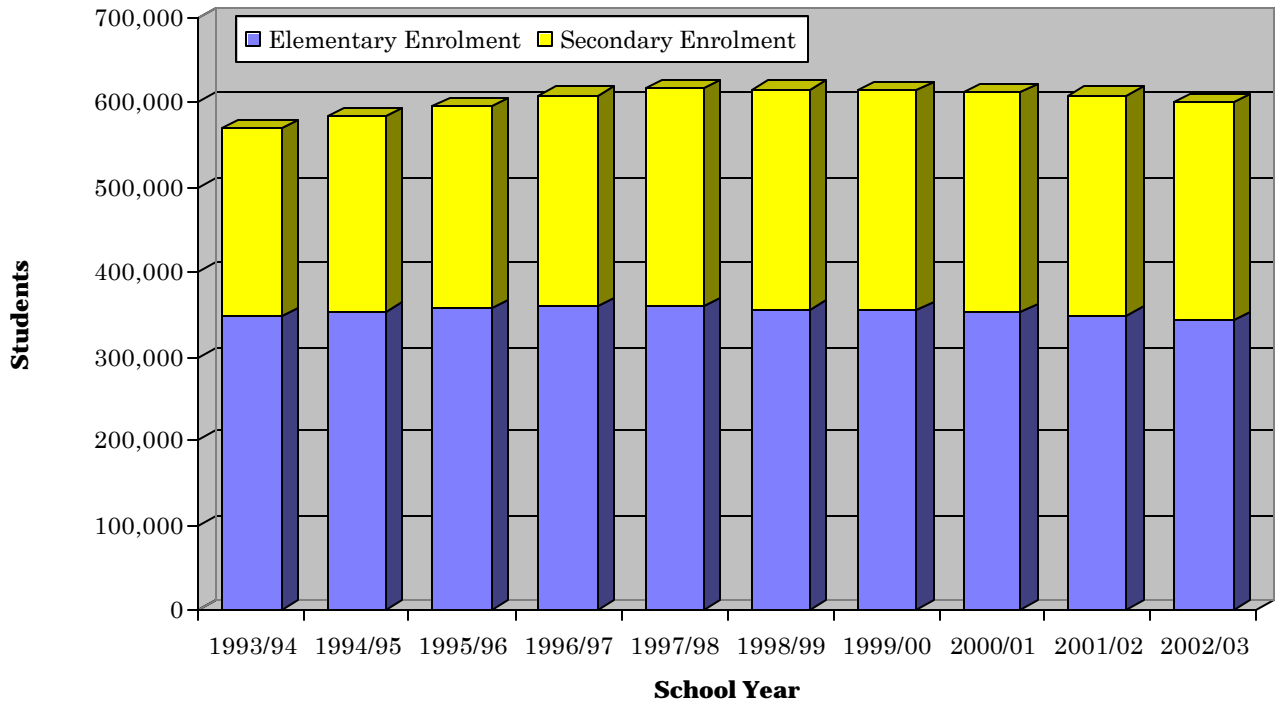

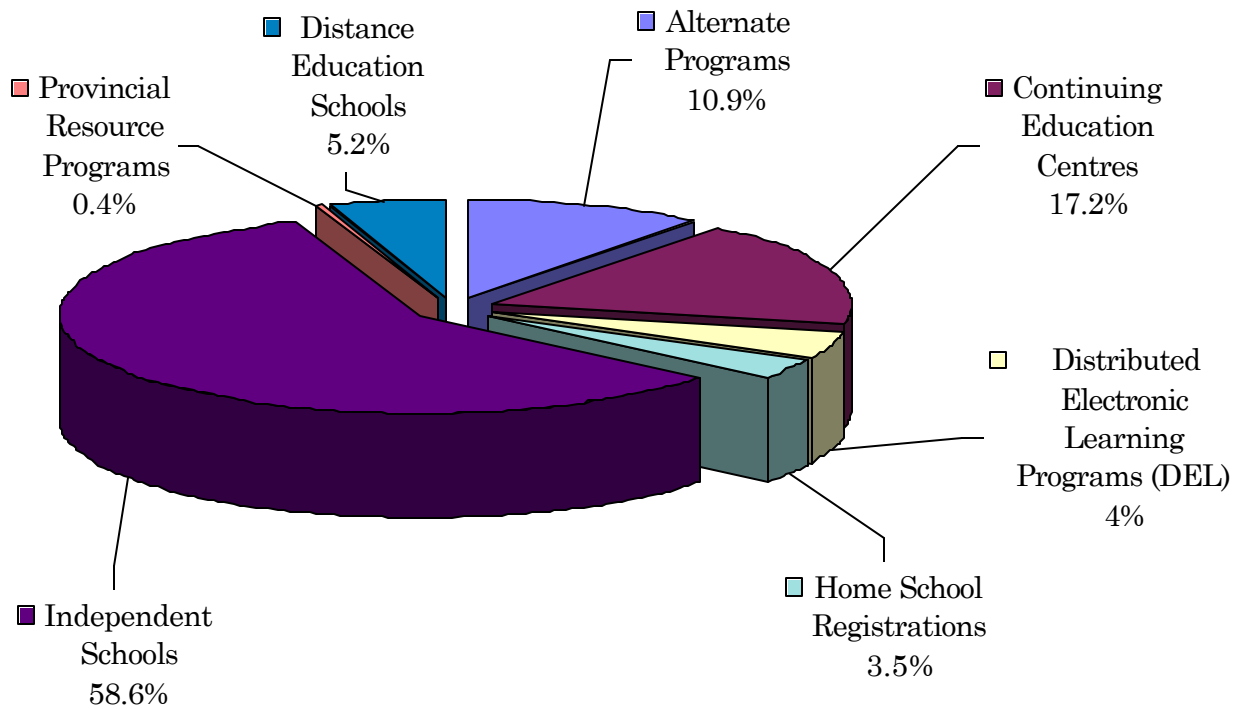

Student Distribution In Alternative Programs



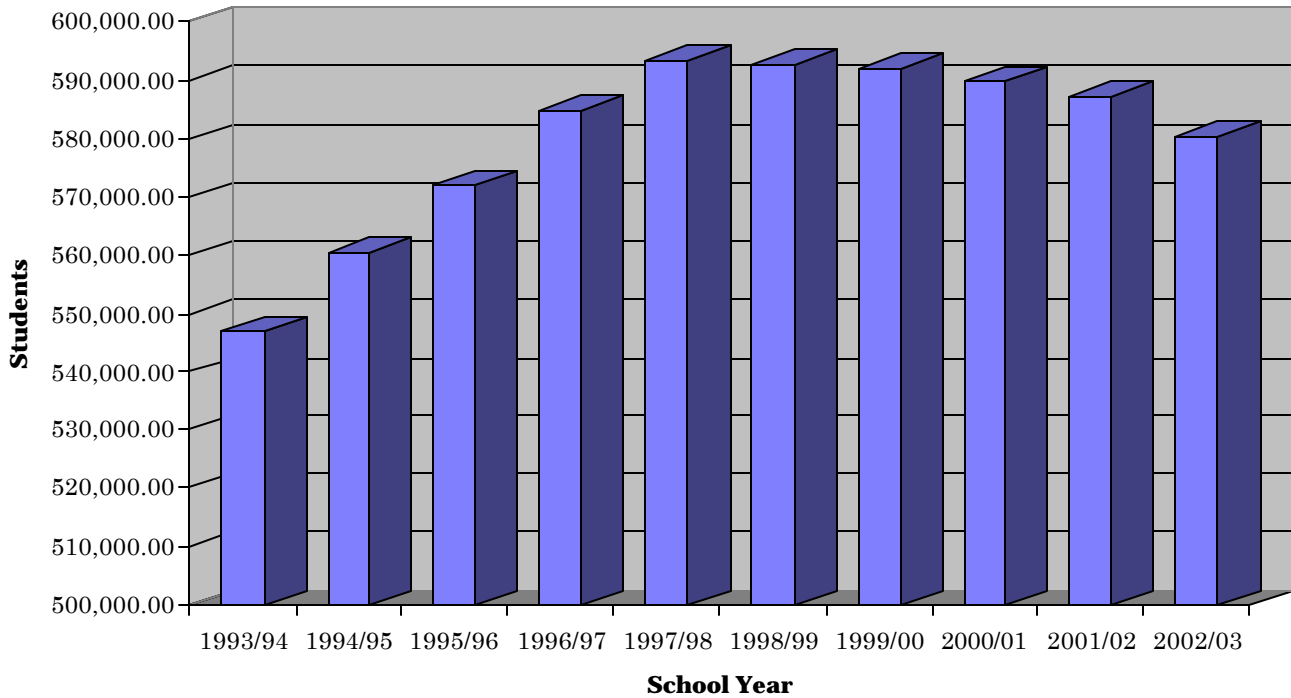

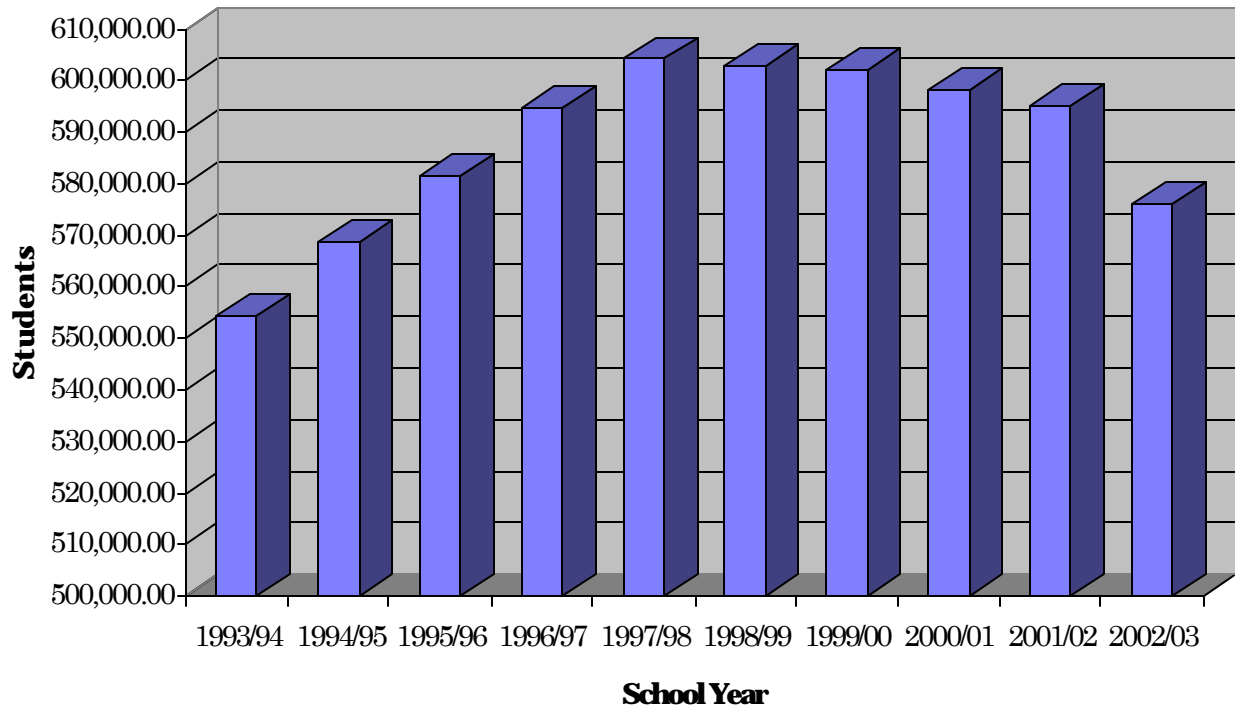

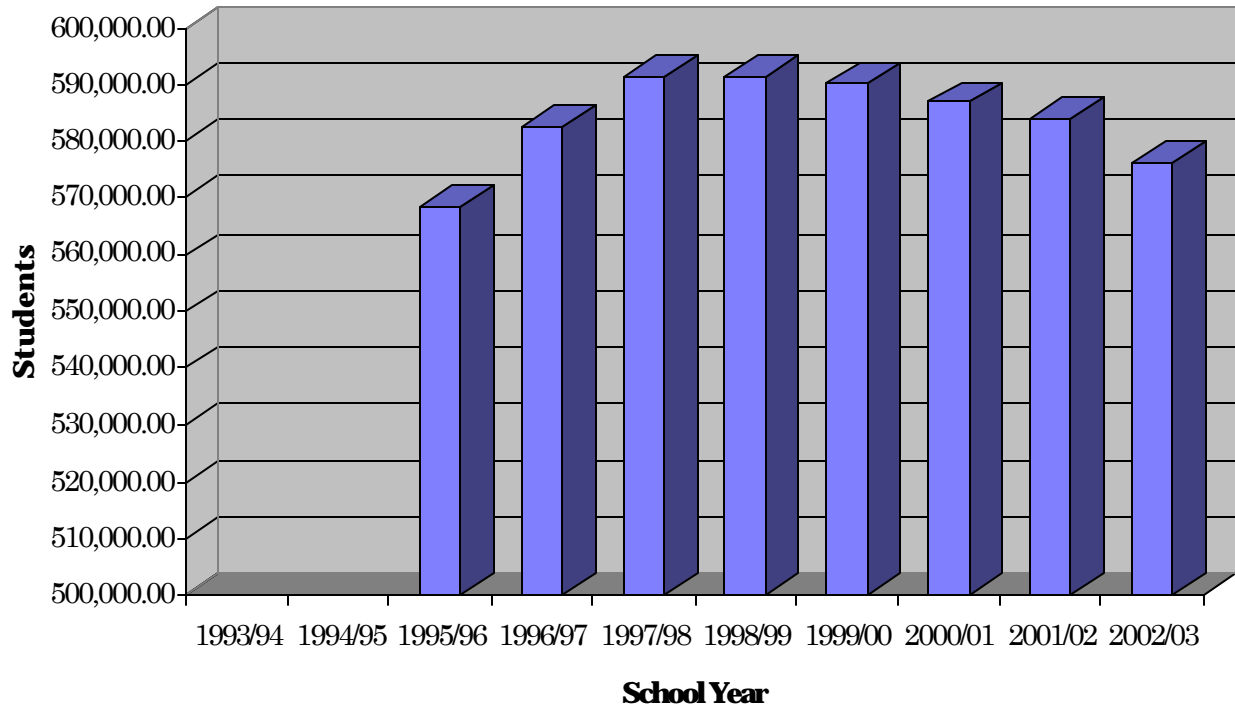

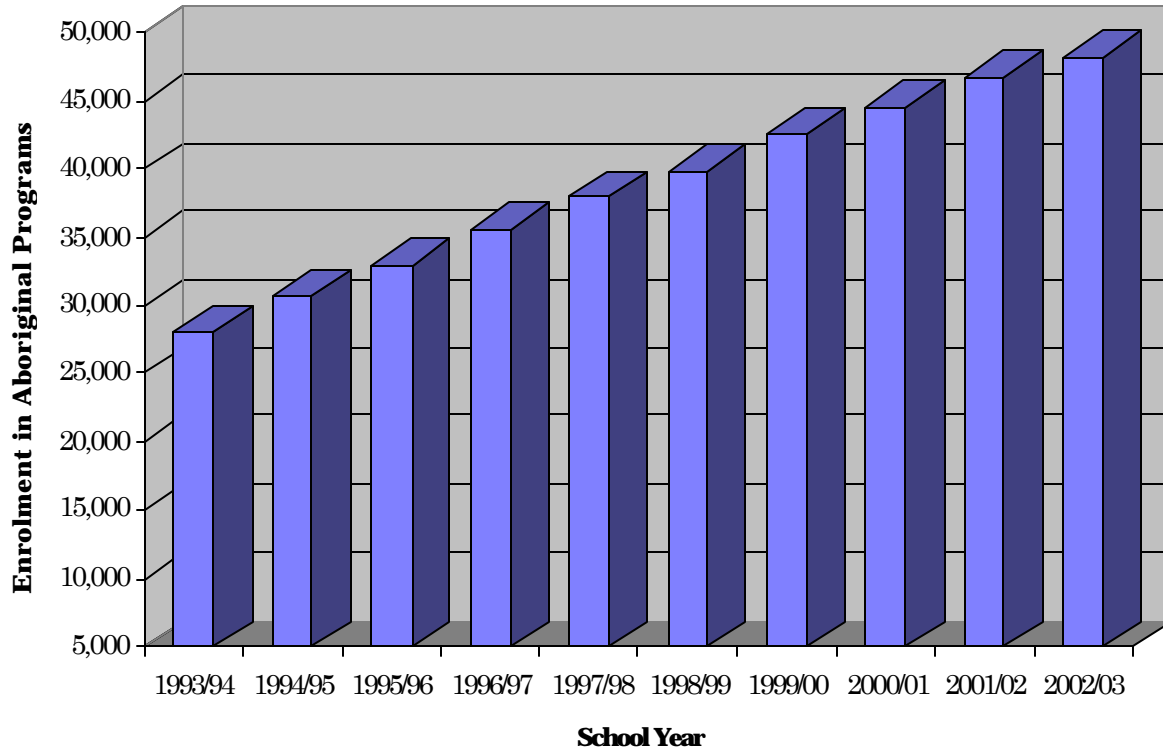

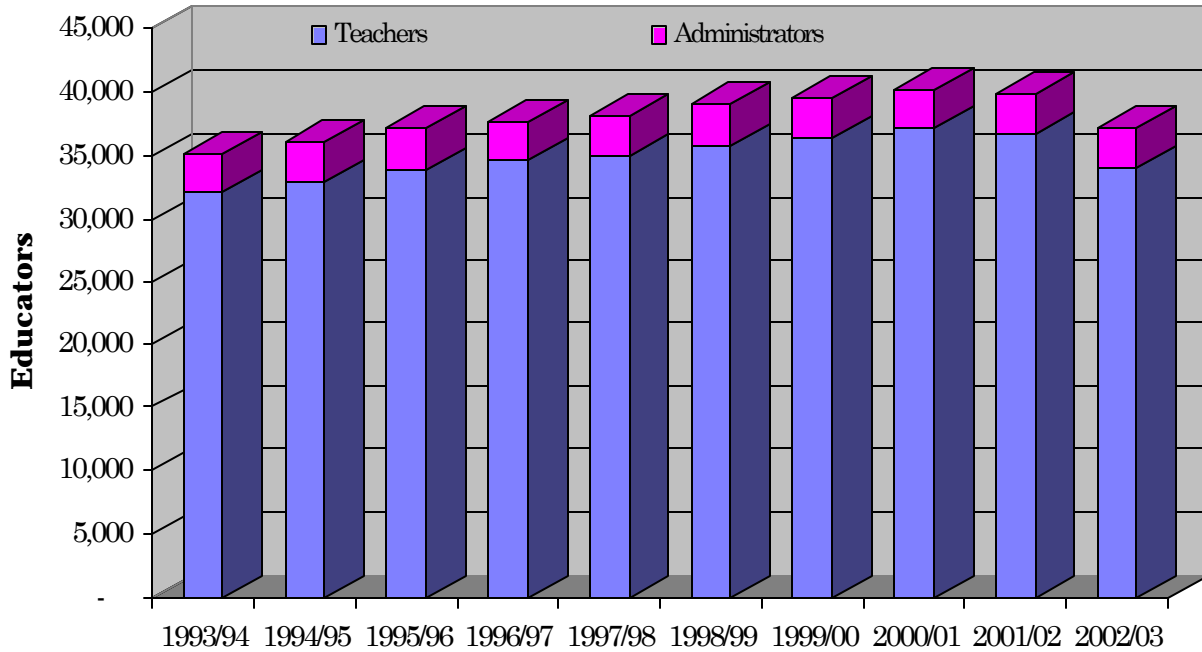

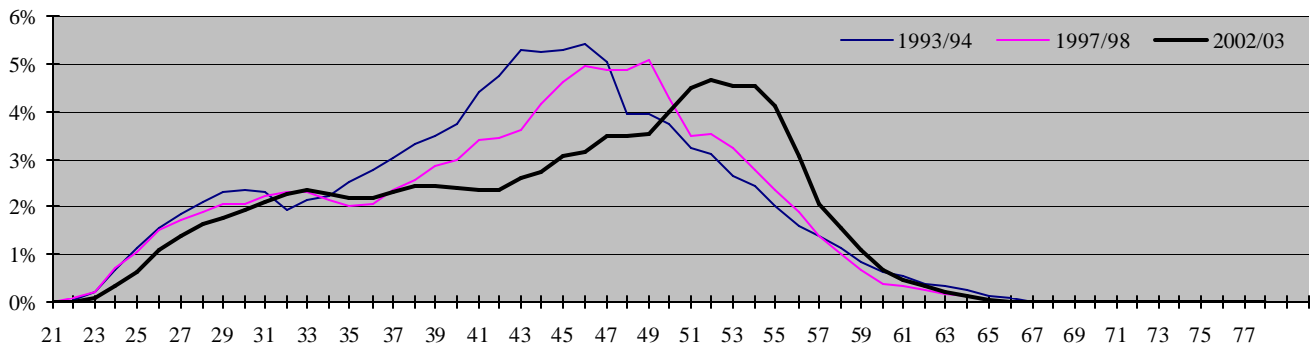
