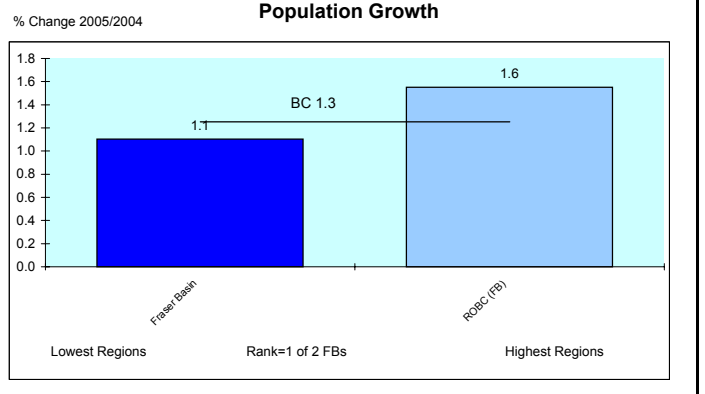

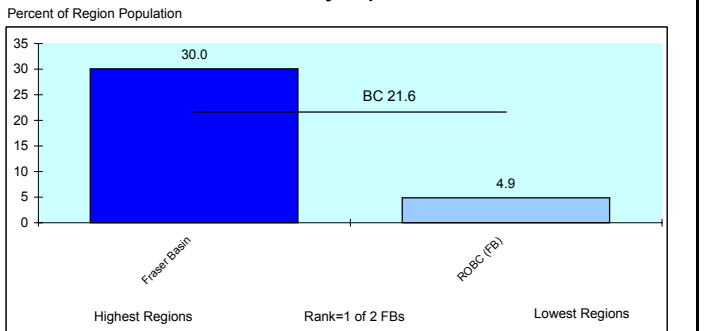

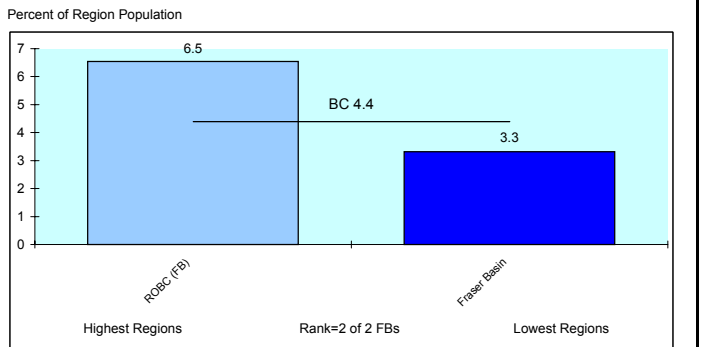

### Visible Minority Population - 2001



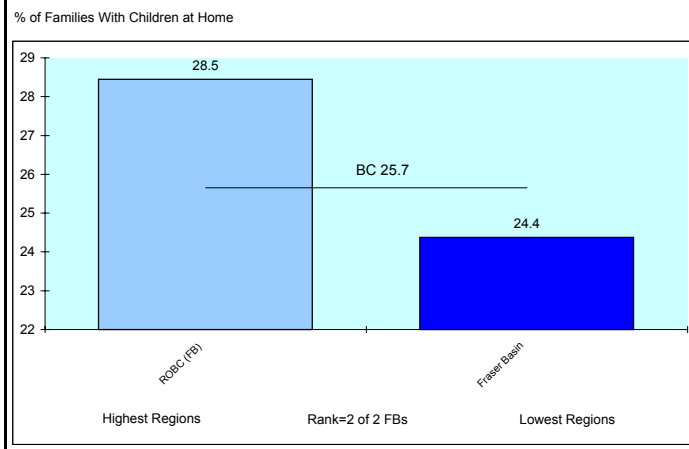

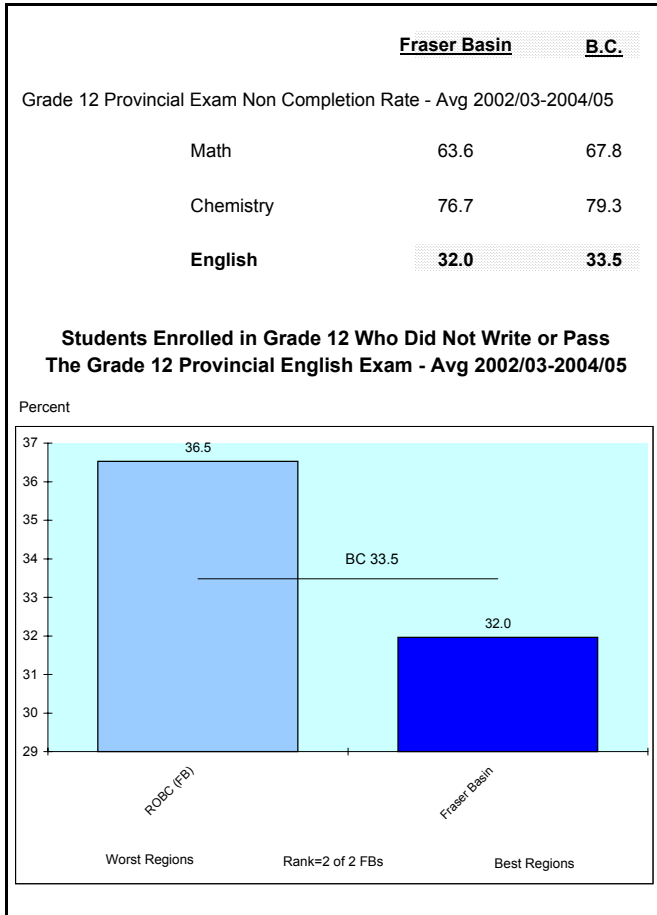

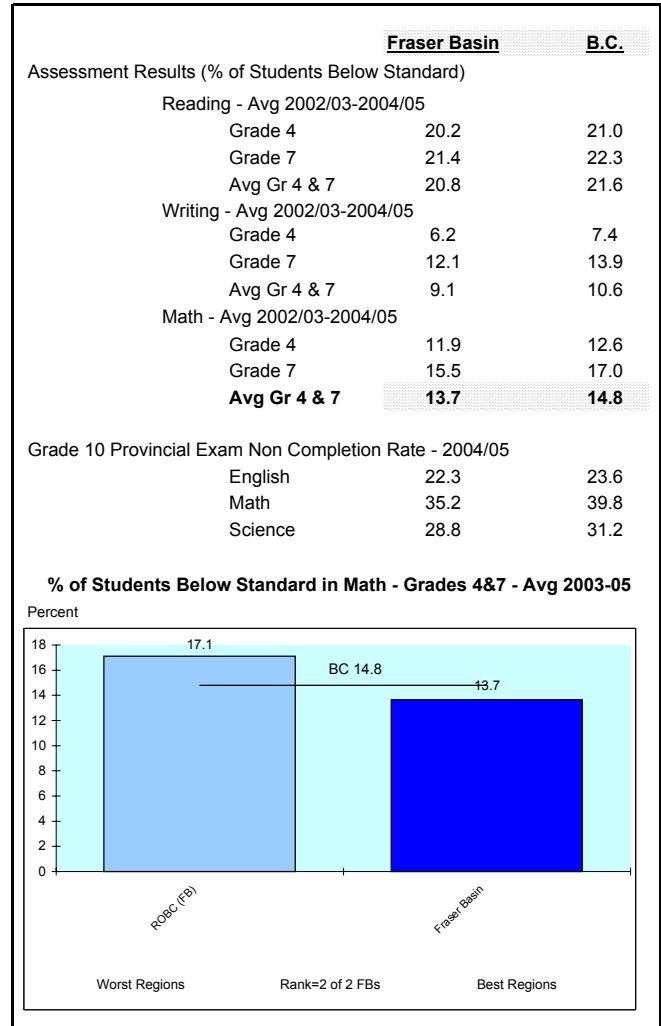

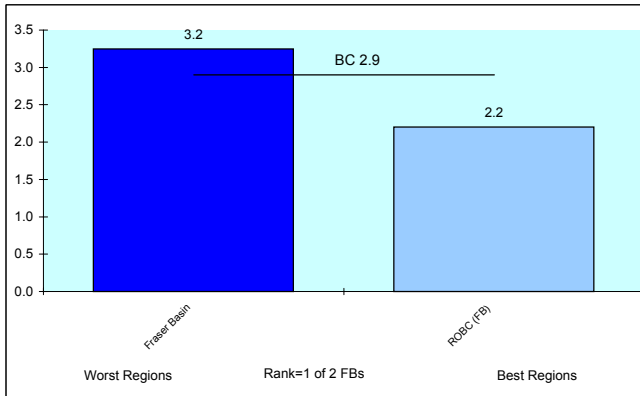

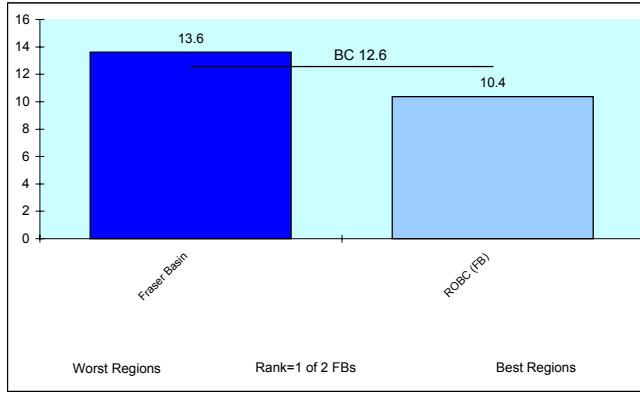
#### Serious Violent Crime Rate - 2002-2004

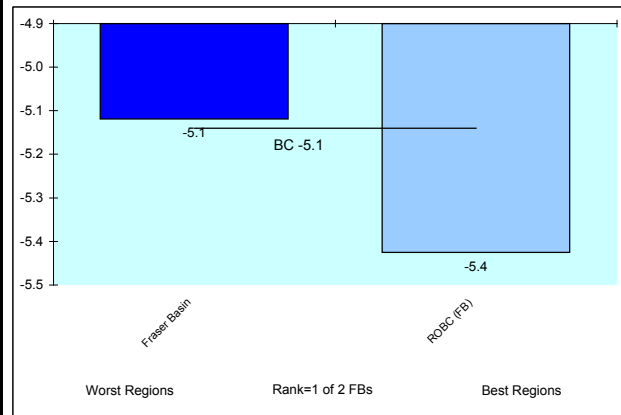

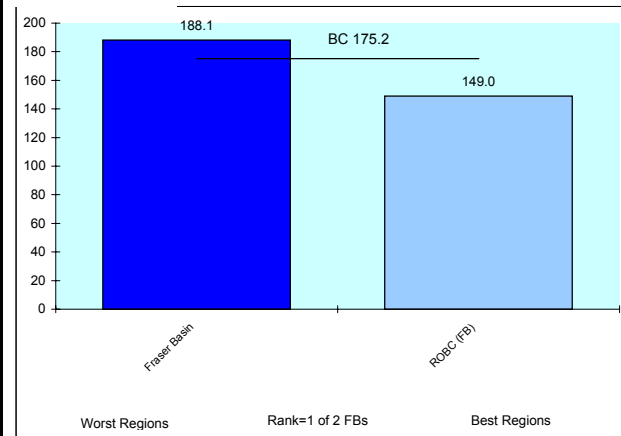

#### Non-Cannabis Drug Offences - Avg 2002-2004

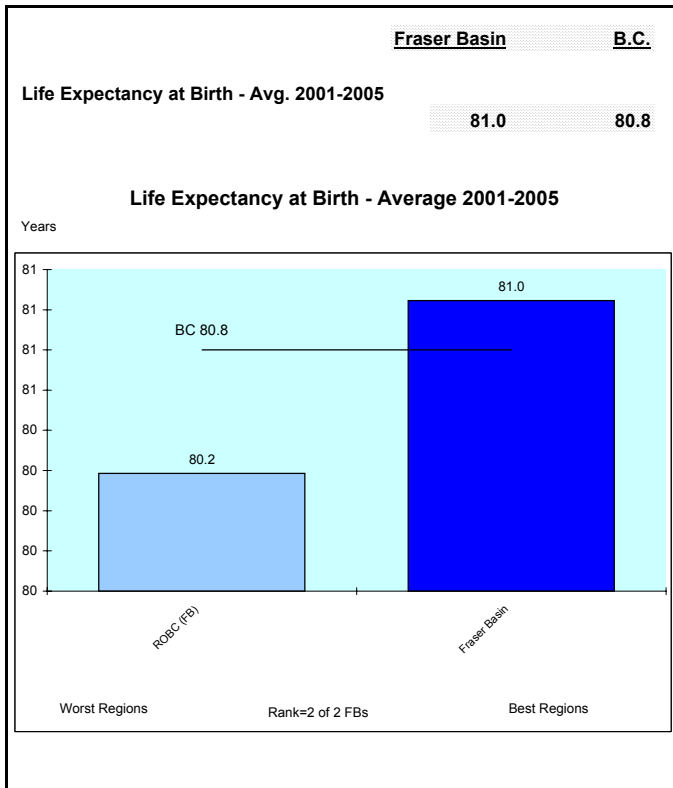
