Dear Mr. Crocock:

Thank you for submitting on August 21st, 2007, the Western Canada Computer Industry Association's (WCCIA) Product Stewardship Plan, as required by section 4 of the Recycling Regulation.

I have completed my review of the plan and I hereby conditionally approve the plan. My approval is with my consideration that this program is a new program and must first establish a base from which to continuously improve. I understand that you intend to start your program on November 1st, 2007.

Please be advised that this conditional approval does not extend to any material or content contained in the plan that is extraneous to the requirements of section 5 of the Recycling Regulation.

The conditions for my approval are as follows:

- 1. WCCIA will provide the director with a baseline for its awareness performance measure by February 1st, 2008.
- 2. WCCIA will provide the director with program progress updates, every three months for one year from start of the program (first update is due February 1st, 2008). The update must include the total number of electronics products sold and collected to date and

- WCCIA's progress towards its spring 2008 (baseline plus 10%) and fall 2008 (baseline plus 20%) awareness performance measure targets.
- 3. WCCIA will provide the director with targets with specific timelines for all the performance measures in the plan by November 1st, 2008.
- 4. WCCIA will post all the information listed in conditions 1-3 above on its public website on the same dates as submitting this information to the director.
