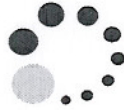

Environmental Assessment of the Proposed Mackenzie Green Energy Centre (MGEC) Project Open House

The B.C. Environmental Assessment Office (EAO) invites the public to comment on the application for an environmental assessment certificate (Application) for the Mackenzie Green Energy Centre Project (Project).

Mackenzie Green Energy LP is proposing to develop a biomass electricity generation facility adjacent to the Pope & Talbot pulp mill in the Mackenzie industrial area. This proposed Project would produce enough electricity to power 50,000 homes.

The proposed Project is subject to review under British Columbia's Environmental Assessment Act, S.B.C. 2002, c.43. The purpose of the public comment period is to document specific public issues as they relate to the technical review of the Application.

The 30-day public comment period began on May 4 and will end on June 3, 2007.
