# Consumer Price Index ◆ March 2012

### Consumer Price Index (2002=100)

### **Highlights**


- British Columbia's Consumer Price Index (CPI) increased 1.6% from March 2011 as year-overyear inflation continued its downward trend of the past year. Provincially, Manitoba (+1.4%) recorded the lowest inflation; British Columbia (+1.6%) followed closely. Prince Edward Island observed the highest overall inflation at 2.8%, while both Nova Scotia and Newfoundland & Labrador recorded a 2.5% increase from February. Nationally, consumer prices increased 1.9% from March 2011.
- Recording the lowest inflation across the Metropolitan areas was Winnipeg (+1.4%), followed by Victoria at 1.5%. Both Saskatoon and Calgary registered a 1.6% index. St. John's and Charlottetown recorded the highest overall inflation at 2.5%, while the bulk of the eastern metro areas (Halifax, Saint John, Quebec City and Toronto) were comparable, all registering an increase of 2.2% from the previous month.
- all-items • British Columbia's March inflation at 1.6% is well within the range of historical experience and very few components exhibit the volatility of the last year. This partly results from a year old spike in Energy and other components now being built into the base of the year-over-year calculation. In comparison to the 2002=100 base, the overall index stands at 117.9, with Food (126.5), Electricity (132.8), Fuel Oil & Other Fuel (250.7) and Gasoline (189.9) among the components providing lift.
- BC's all items CPI (excluding energy) was up 1.1% from last year. The comparable figure for Canada was a 1.6% increase.

Also excluded is the effect of changes in indirect taxes on the remaining components.

# Consumer Price Index—Terms and Definitions

#### **Base Effect**

The 12-month variation in the CPI is calculated by comparing the current month's index with the index for the same month of the previous year. The 12-month change is represented by the difference in the indexes of the reference months. Thus, the 12-month variation can decrease from one month to the next merely because the base serving as the point of comparison increased.

#### **Twelve-Month Percent Changes**

Also referred to as "year-over-year", twelvemonth percent changes compare indexes for a given month to indexes for the same month of the previous year. As they compare two points in time, they are influenced by unusual or temporary events that can affect either of the two months. Their calculation does not include any of the intervening monthly indexes.

## **Annual Average Index**

Annual average indexes are calculated by averaging index levels over the 12 months of the calendar year. These data should not be confused with the 12-month change in the CPI. By the nature of the calculation, averaging

indexes over the calendar year gives a better representation of price behaviour over the whole year and is closer to the concept of an average price. The use of annual averages is considered the preferred option for indexation purposes.

### **Latest Twelve-Month Average Index**

The latest twelve-month average index (ending in the current month) is a 12-month moving average of the indexes of the most recent 12 months. It is calculated like the annual average index. Hence, in theory, the December twelve-month average index would be equal to the annual average index for the calendar year. However, in practice, when BC Stats makes these calculations from published data, the December 12-month average index may differ from Statistics Canada's published annual average index due to rounding.

#### **Harmonized Sales Tax**

On July 1, 2010, the Harmonized Sales Tax (HST) came into effect in British Columbia and Ontario. As well, Nova Scotia increased its HST by two percentage points.




