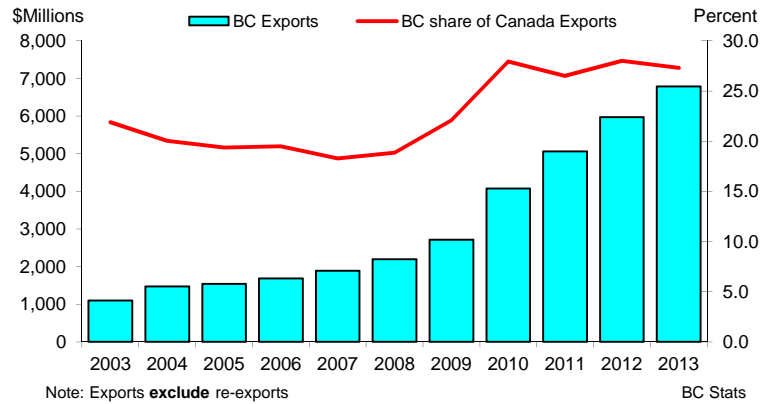

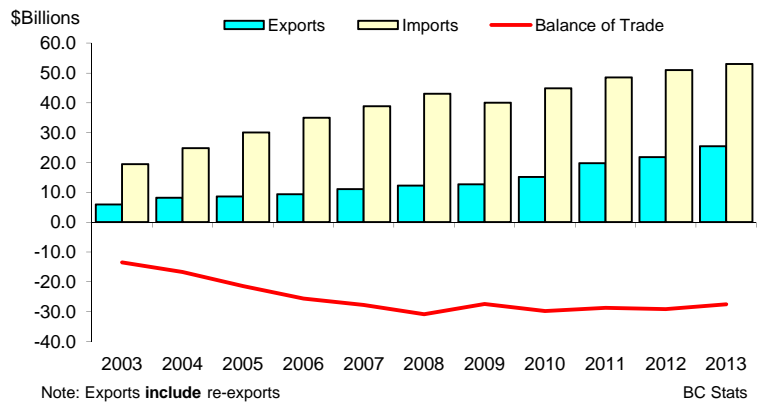

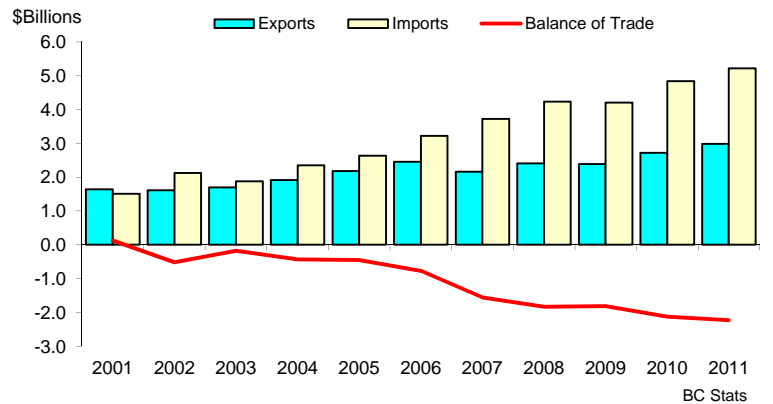
BC Origin Exports to China & Hong Kong

How important is China & Hong Kong to BC and Canada?

China & Hong Kong ranked #32 as a destination for BC origin exports in 2013 with 20.2% of BC's commodity exports shipped there. It was ranked #2 as a destination for Canadian exports with 5.6% of Canadian goods exports shipped there and #2 as a source of imports into Canada with 11.2% of Canadian imports originating from China & Hong Kong.

How important is Canada to China & Hong Kong?

Canada was the source of approximately 0.6% of imports into China & Hong Kong in 2012. Approximately 1.7% of exports from China & Hong Kong were destined for Canada in that year.

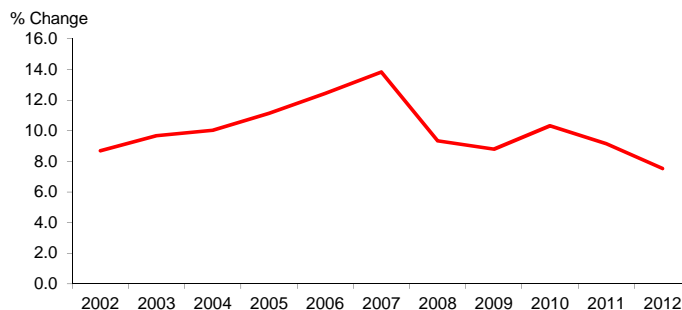

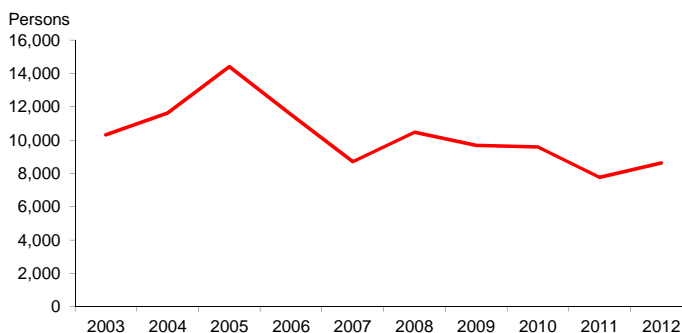
Year-Over-Year % Growth in GDP of China & Hong Kong

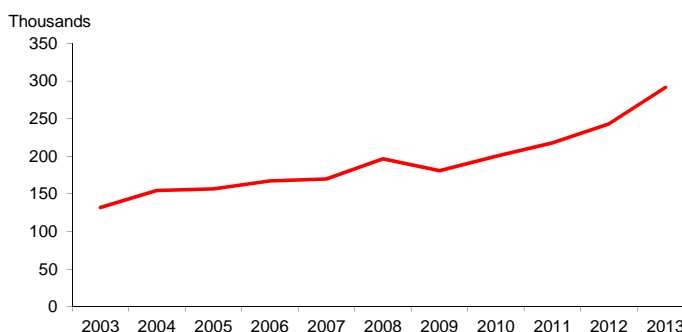
Immigrants to BC from China & Hong Kong
