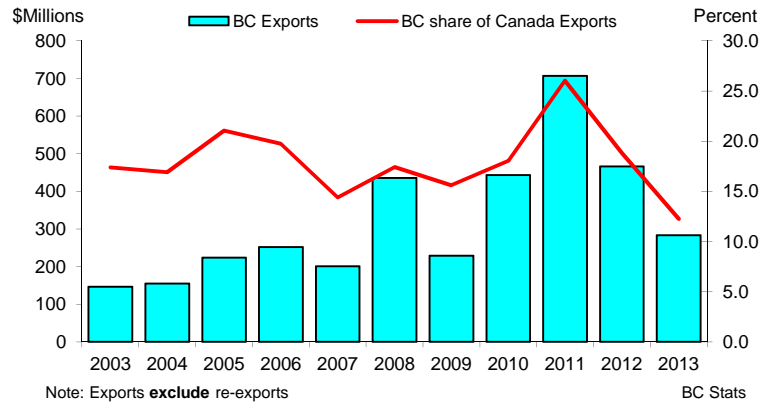

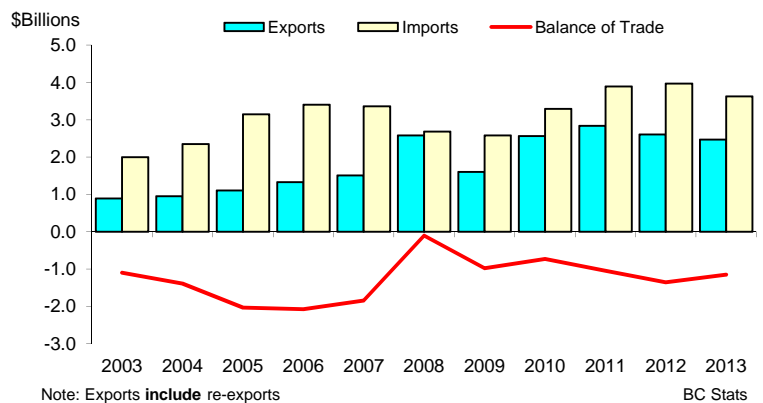
BC Origin Exports to Brazil

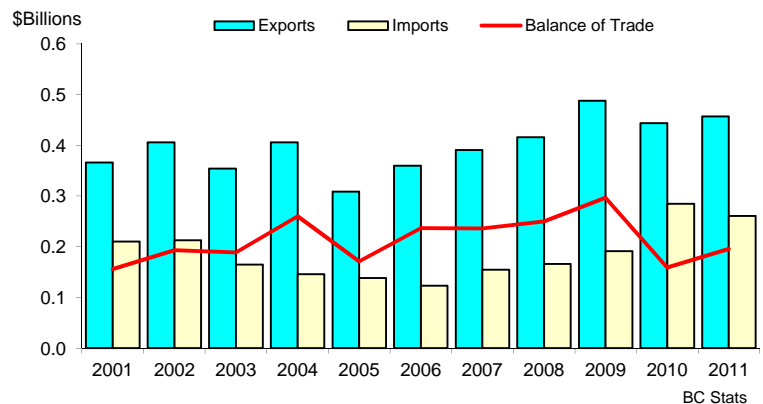
Canada's Balance of Trade in Goods with Brazil

How important is Brazil to BC and Canada?

Brazil ranked #10 as a destination for BC origin exports in 2013 with 0.8% of BC's commodity exports shipped there. It was ranked #12 as a destination for Canadian exports with 0.5% of Canadian goods exports shipped there and #13 as a source of imports into Canada with 0.8% of Canadian imports originating from Brazil.

How important is Canada to Brazil?

Canada was the source of approximately 1.1% of imports into Brazil in 2012. Approximately 1.3% of exports from Brazil were destined for Canada in that year.

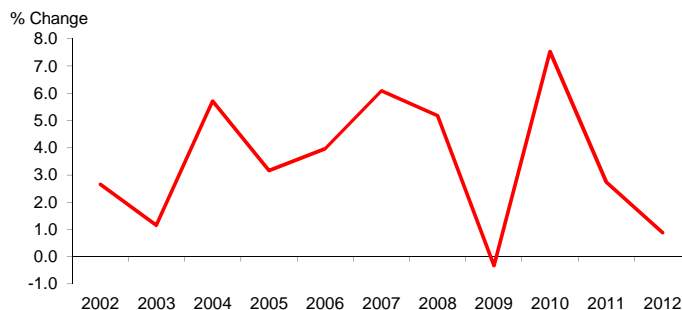

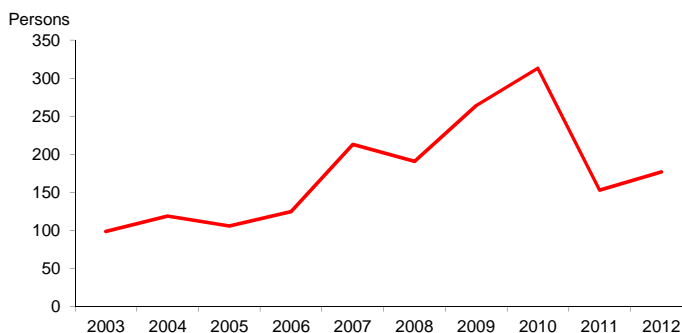
Year-Over-Year % Growth in GDP of Brazil

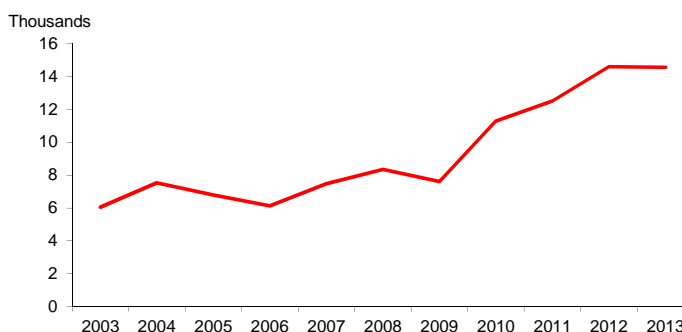
Immigrants to BC from Brazil
