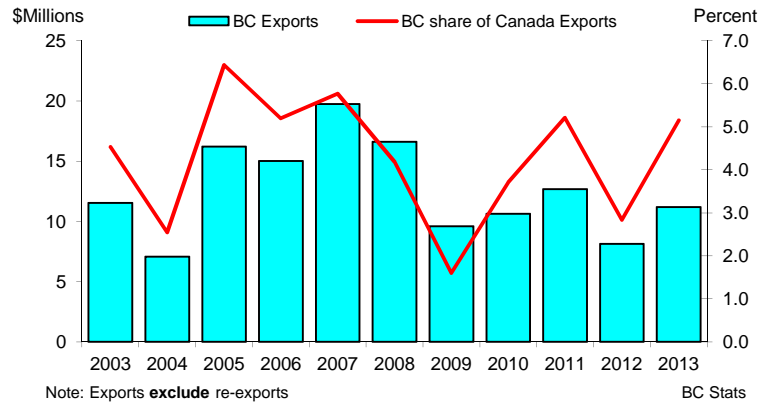

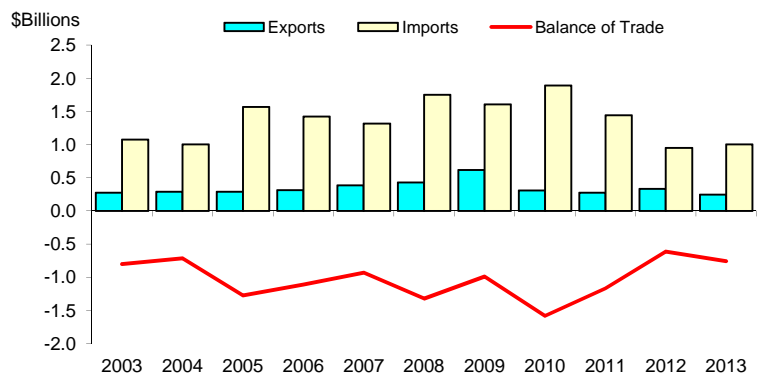
BC Origin Exports to Denmark

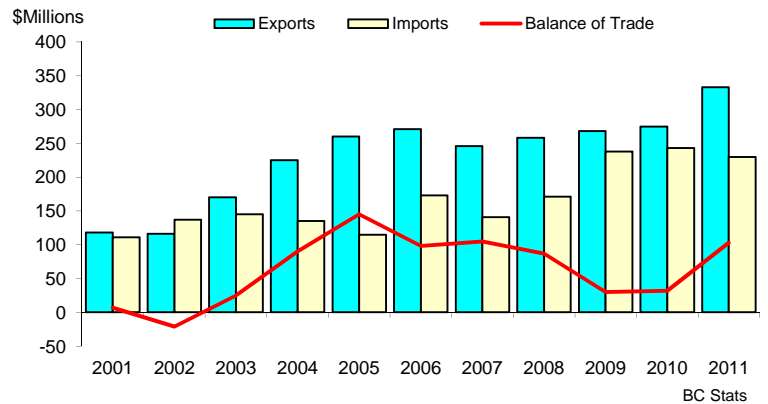
Canada's Balance of Trade in Goods with Denmark

How important is Denmark to BC and Canada?

Denmark ranked #51 as a destination for BC origin exports in 2013 with 0.0% of BC's commodity exports shipped there. It was ranked #53 as a destination for Canadian exports with 0.0% of Canadian goods exports shipped there and #44 as a source of imports into Canada with 0.2% of Canadian imports originating from Denmark.

How important is Canada to Denmark?

Canada was the source of approximately 0.3% of imports into Denmark in 2012. Approximately 1.7% of exports from Denmark were destined for Canada in that year.

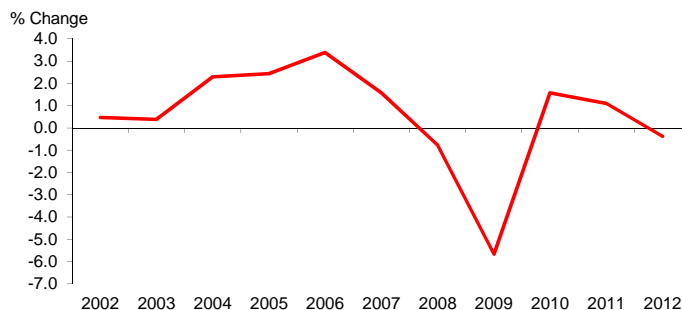

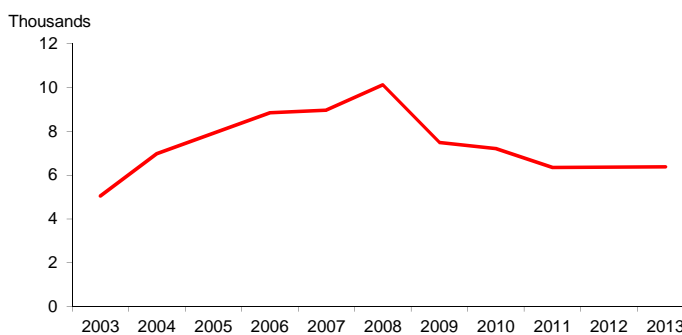
Immigrants to BC from Denmark
