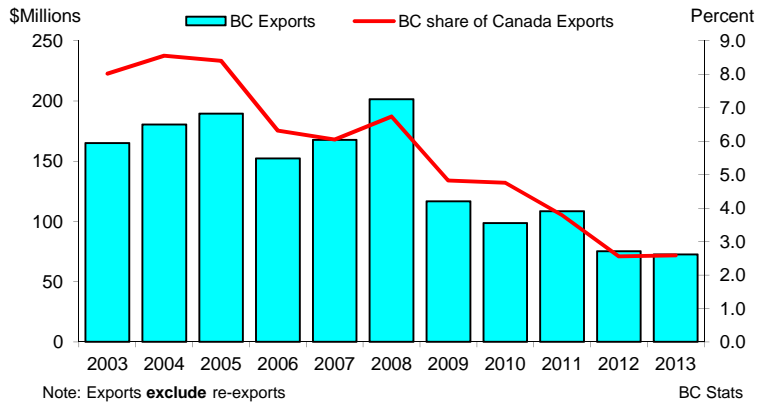

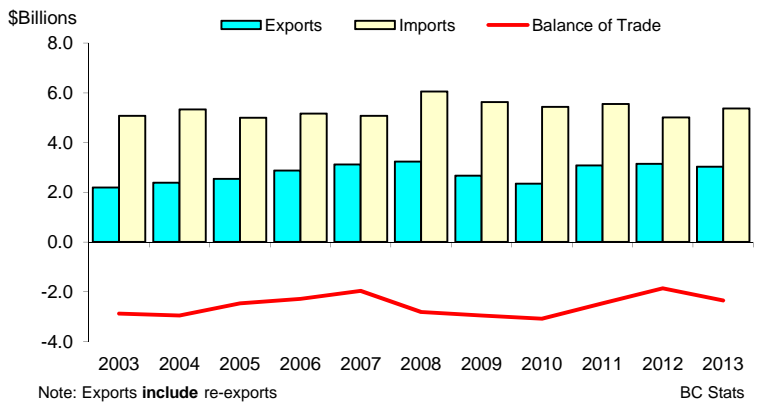

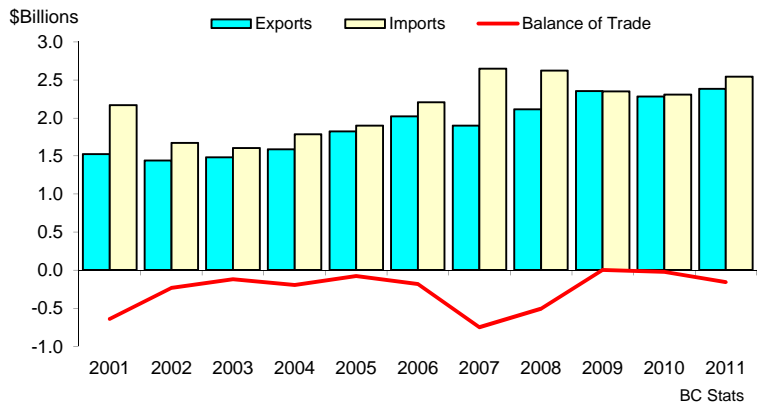
BC Origin Exports to France

How important is France to BC and Canada?

France ranked #26 as a destination for BC origin exports in 2013 with 0.2% of BC's commodity exports shipped there. It was ranked #10 as a destination for Canadian exports with 0.6% of Canadian goods exports shipped there and #9 as a source of imports into Canada with 1.1% of Canadian imports originating from France.

How important is Canada to France?

Canada was the source of approximately 0.3% of imports into France in 2012. Approximately 0.9% of exports from France were destined for Canada in that year.

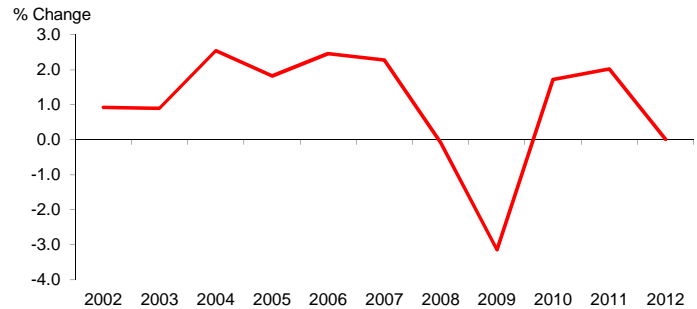

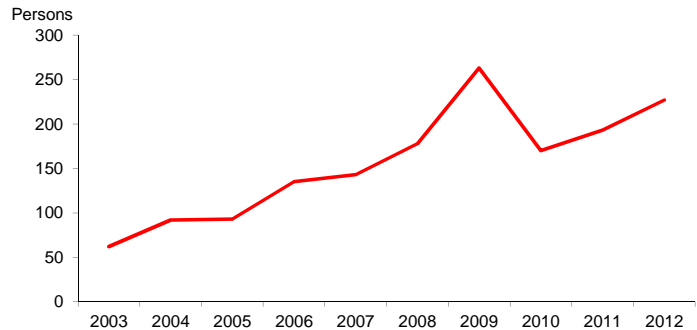
Year-Over-Year % Growth in GDP of France

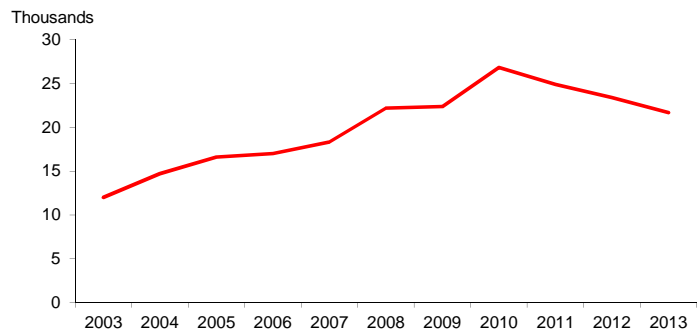
Immigrants to BC from France
