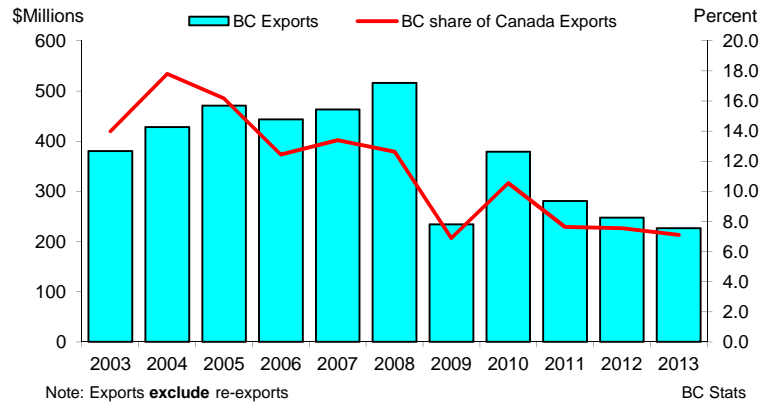

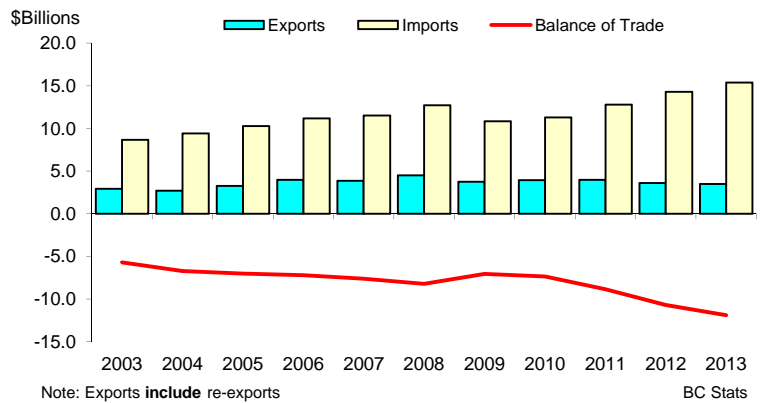
BC Origin Exports to Germany

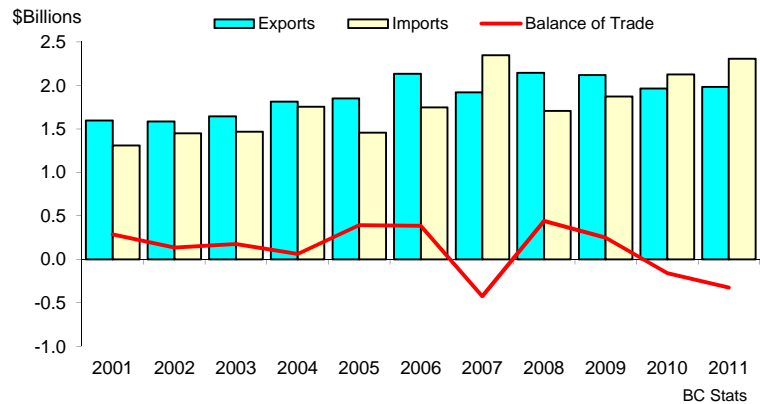
Canada's Balance of Trade in Goods with Germany

How important is Germany to BC and Canada?

Germany ranked #12 as a destination for BC origin exports in 2013 with 0.7% of BC's commodity exports shipped there. It was ranked #9 as a destination for Canadian exports with 0.7% of Canadian goods exports shipped there and #4 as a source of imports into Canada with 3.2% of Canadian imports originating from Germany.

How important is Canada to Germany?

Canada was the source of approximately 0.3% of imports into Germany in 2012. Approximately 0.8% of exports from Germany were destined for Canada in that year.

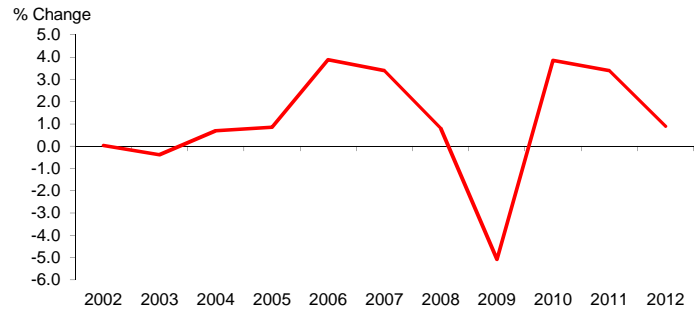

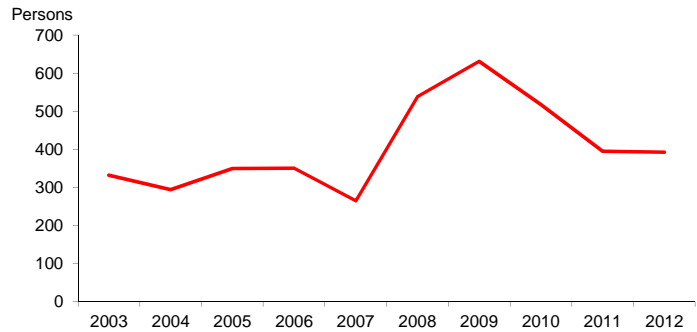
Year-Over-Year % Growth in GDP of Germany

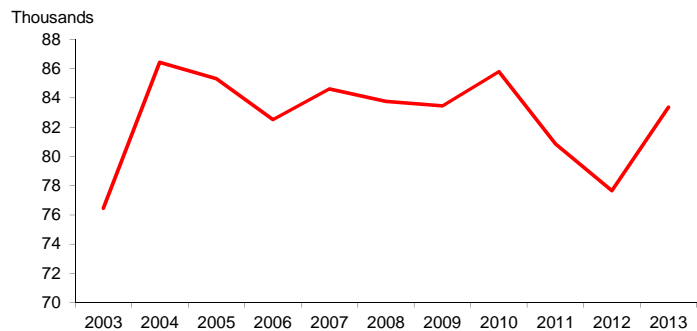
Immigrants to BC from Germany
