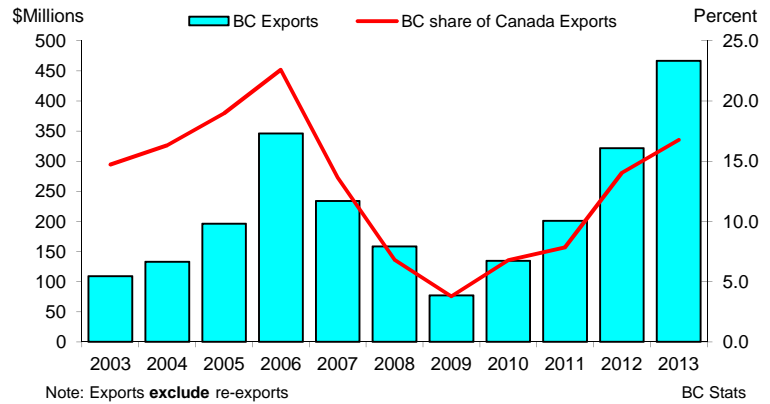

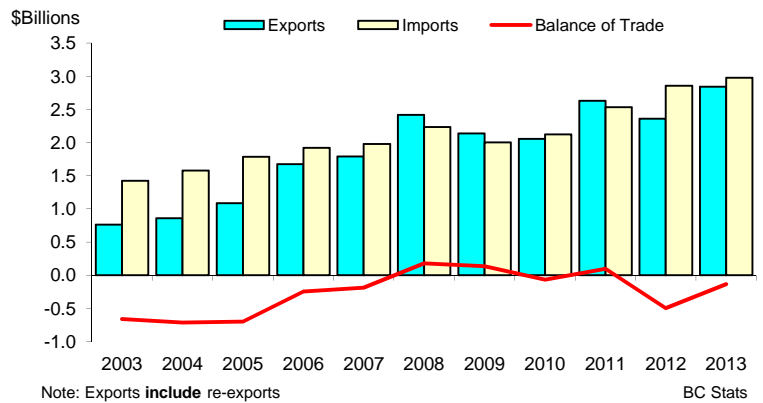

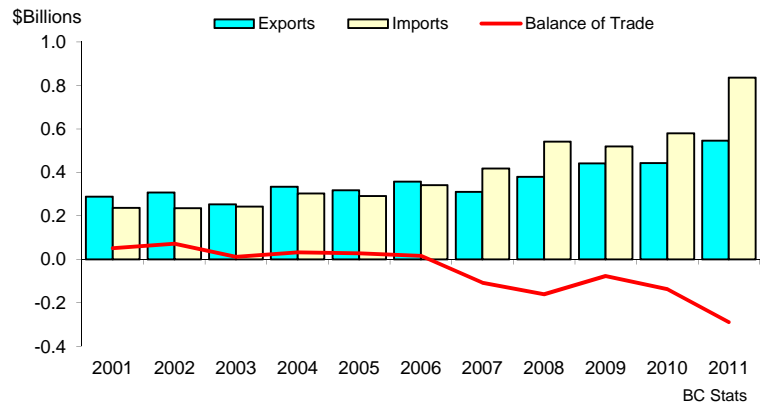
## BC Origin Exports to India

### How important is India to BC and Canada?

India ranked #6 as a destination for BC origin exports in 2013 with 1.4% of BC's commodity exports shipped there. It was ranked #11 as a destination for Canadian goods exports shipped there and #19 as a source of imports into Canada with 0.6% of Canadian imports originating from India.

### How important is Canada to India?

Canada was the source of approximately 0.4% of imports into India in 2012. Approximately 0.7% of exports from India were destined for Canada in that year.

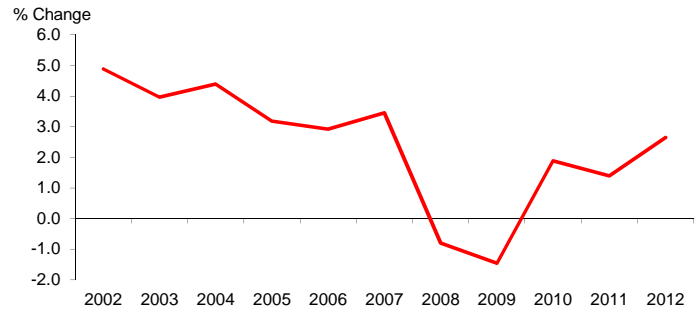

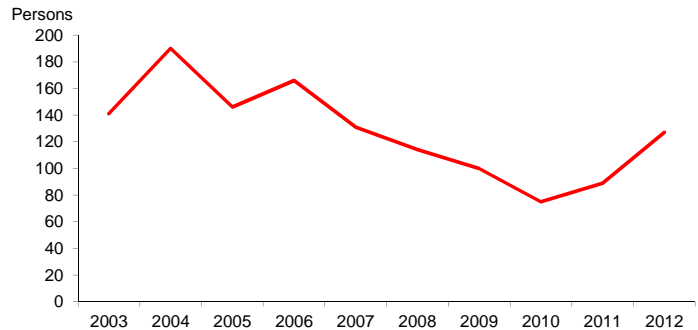
### Year-Over-Year % Growth in GDP of India

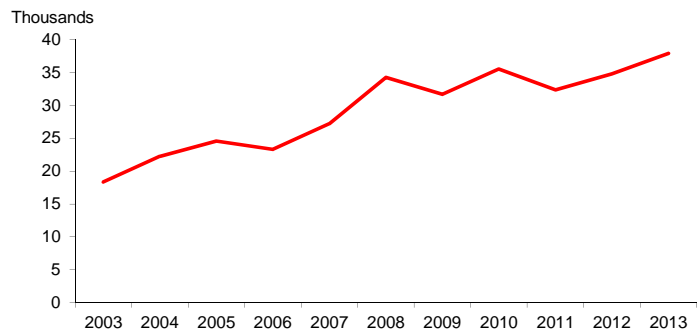
### Immigrants to BC from India
