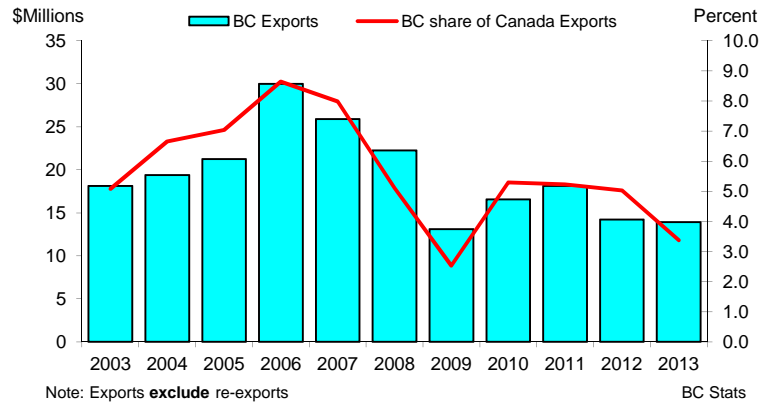

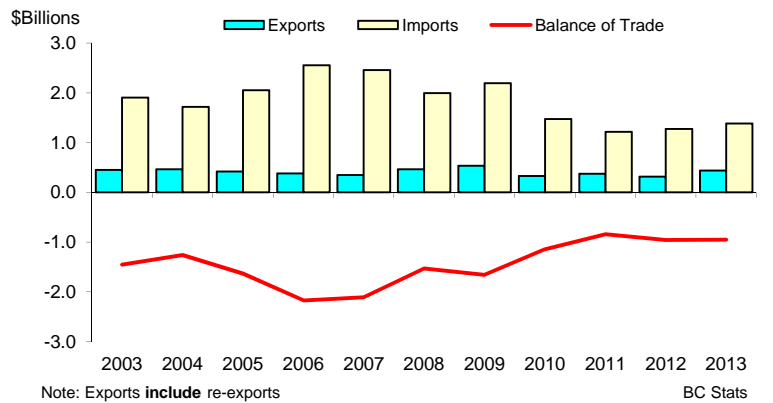

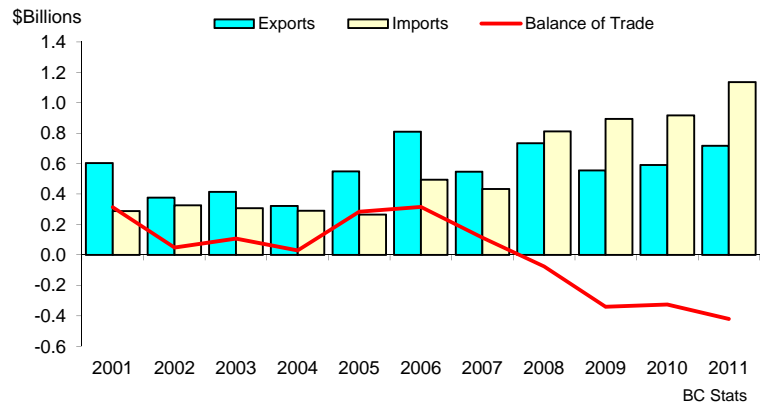
BC Origin Exports to Ireland

How important is Ireland to BC and Canada?

Ireland ranked #46 as a destination for BC origin exports in 2013 with 0.0% of BC's commodity exports shipped there. It was ranked #38 as a destination for Canadian exports with 0.1% of Canadian goods exports shipped there and #33 as a source of imports into Canada with 0.3% of Canadian imports originating from Ireland.

How important is Canada to Ireland?

Canada was the source of approximately 0.5% of imports into Ireland in 2012. Approximately 1.2% of exports from Ireland were destined for Canada in that year.

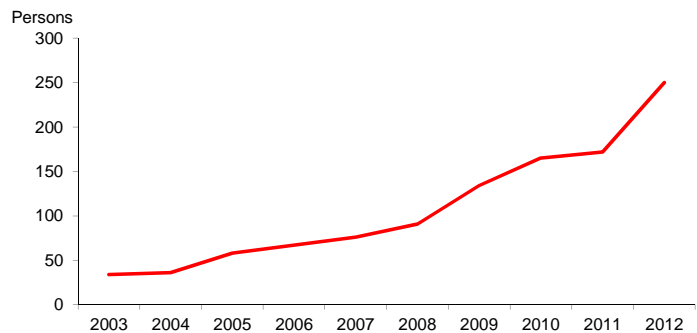
Year-Over-Year % Growth in GDP of Ireland

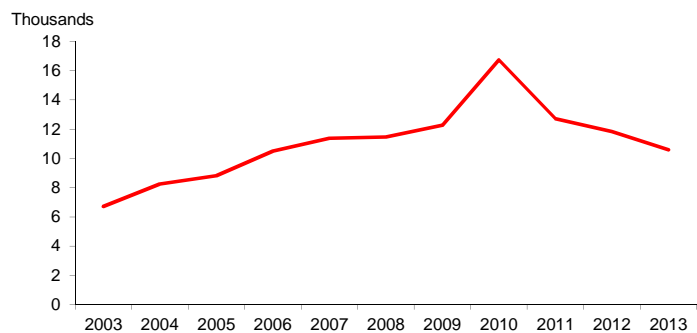
Immigrants to BC from Ireland
