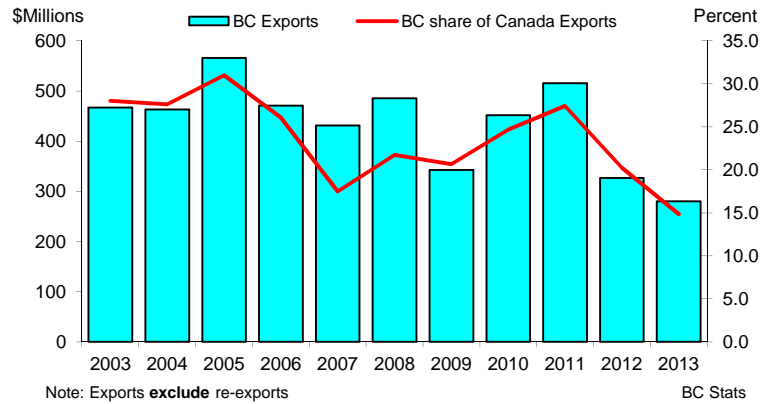

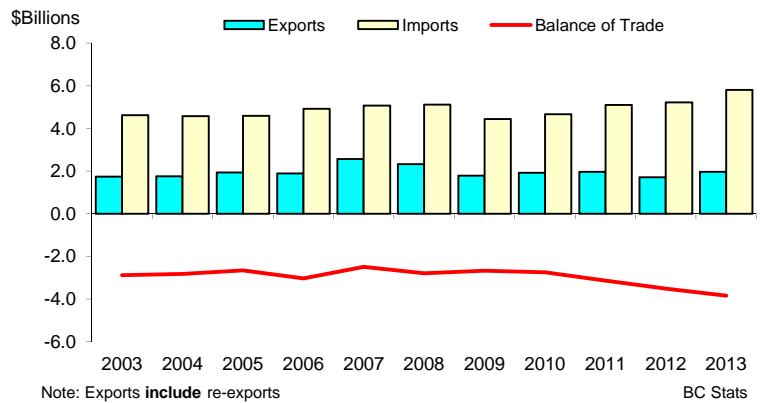

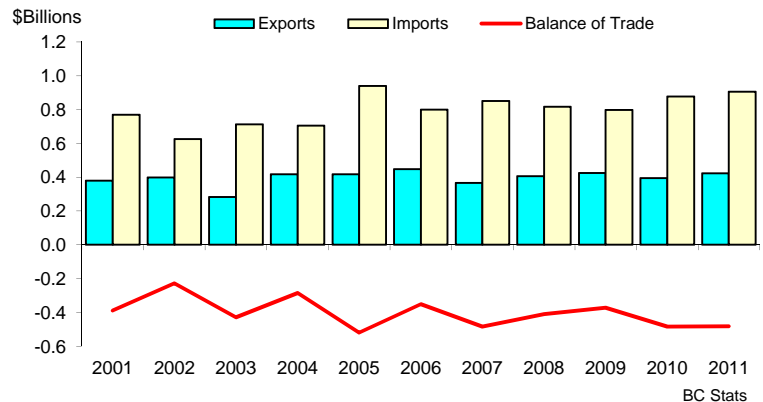
## BC Origin Exports to Italy

### How important is Italy to BC and Canada?

Italy ranked #11 as a destination for BC origin exports in 2013 with 0.8% of BC's commodity exports shipped there. It was ranked #15 as a destination for Canadian exports with 0.4% of Canadian goods exports shipped there and #8 as a source of imports into Canada with 1.2% of Canadian imports originating from Italy.

### How important is Canada to Italy?

Canada was the source of approximately 0.4% of imports into Italy in 2012. Approximately 0.9% of exports from Italy were destined for Canada in that year.

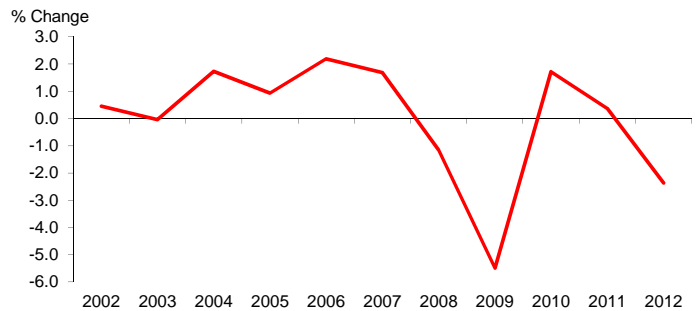

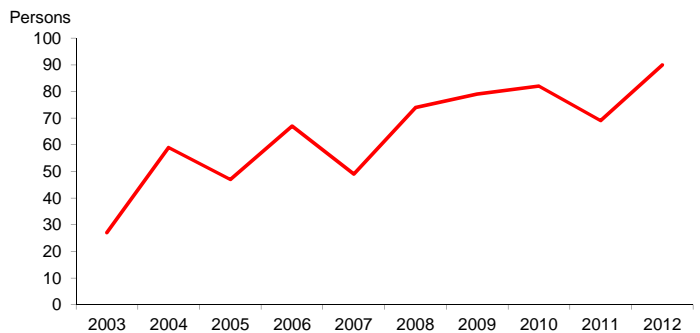
### Year-Over-Year % Growth in GDP of Italy

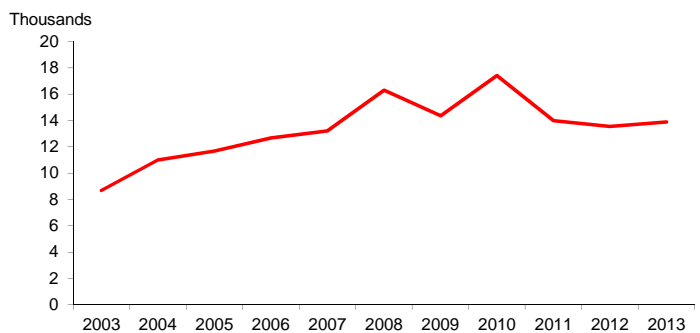
### Immigrants to BC from Italy
