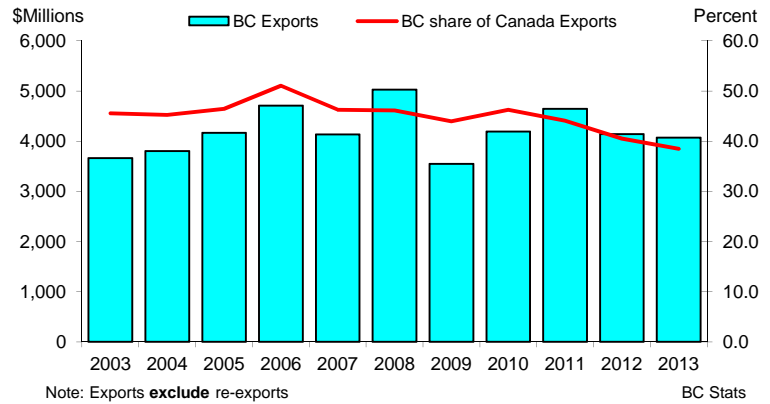

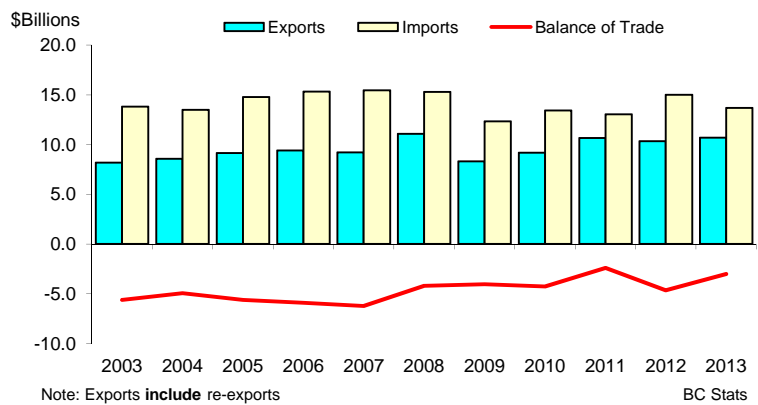
BC Origin Exports to Japan

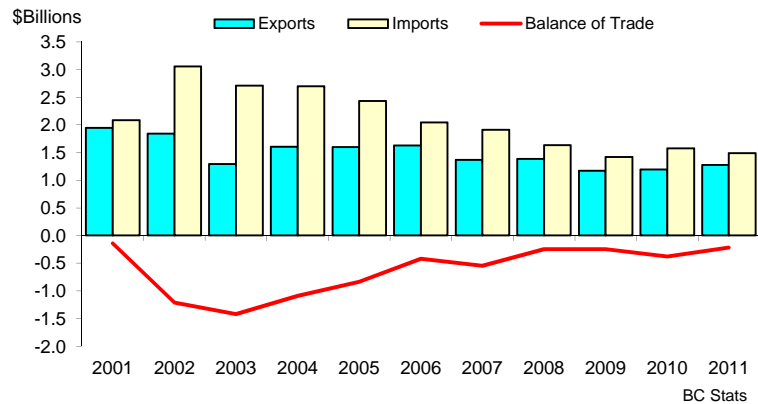
Canada's Balance of Trade in Goods with Japan

How important is Japan to BC and Canada?

Japan ranked #3 as a destination for BC origin exports in 2013 with 12.1% of BC's commodity exports shipped there. It was ranked #4 as a destination for Canadian exports with 2.4% of Canadian goods exports shipped there and #5 as a source of imports into Canada with 2.9% of Canadian imports originating from Japan.

How important is Canada to Japan?

Canada was the source of approximately 1.0% of imports into Japan in 2012. Approximately 1.6% of exports from Japan were destined for Canada in that year.

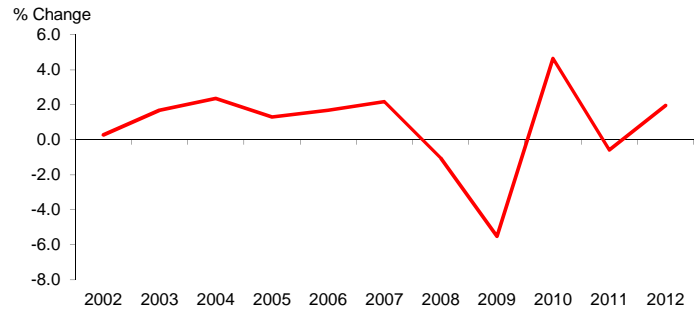

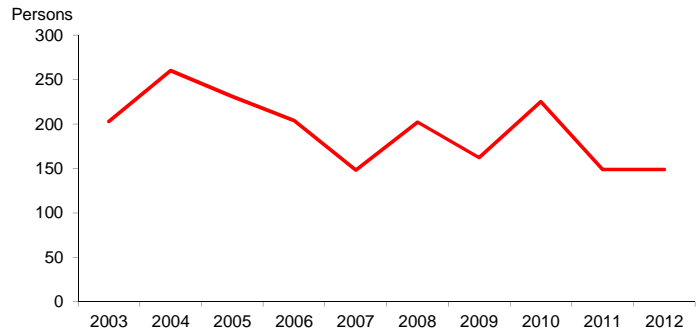
Year-Over-Year % Growth in GDP of Japan

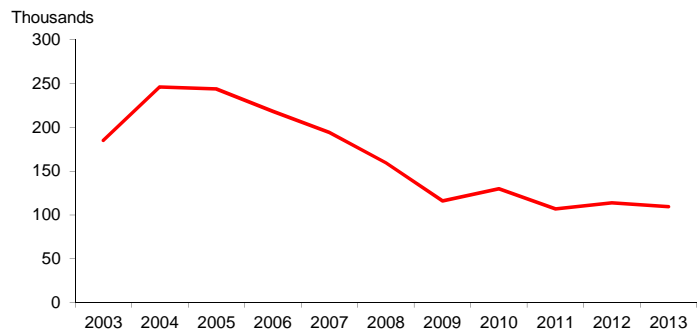
Immigrants to BC from Japan
