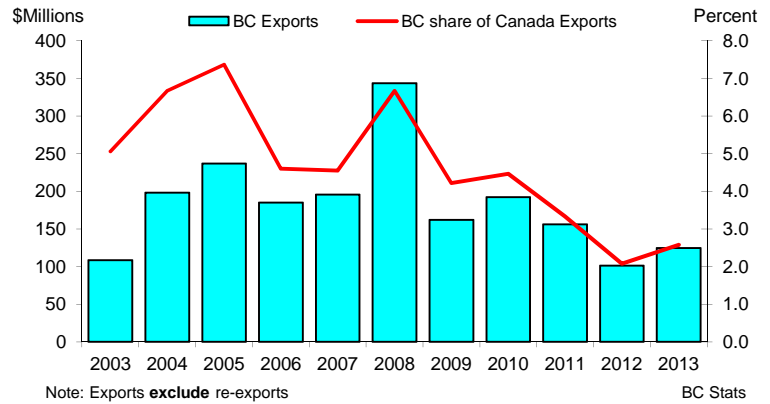

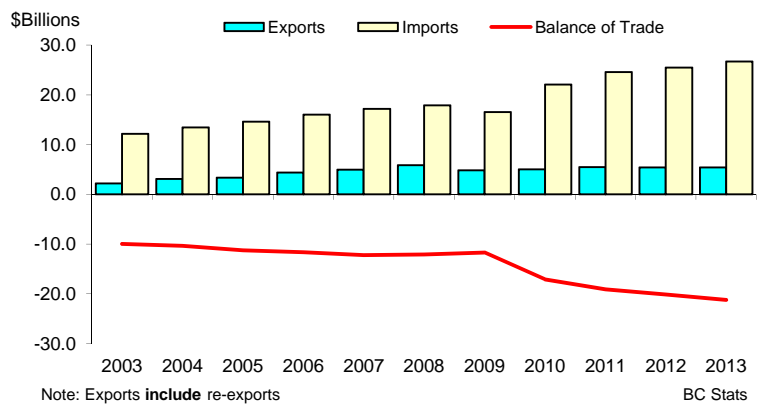

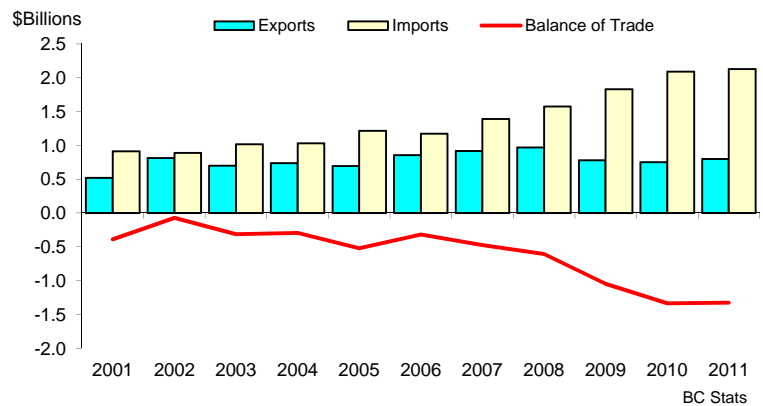
BC Origin Exports to Mexico

How important is Mexico to BC and Canada?

Mexico ranked #17 as a destination for BC origin exports in 2013 with 0.4% of BC's commodity exports shipped there. It was ranked #5 as a destination for Canadian exports with 1.1% of Canadian goods exports shipped there and #3 as a source of imports into Canada with 5.6% of Canadian imports originating from Mexico.

How important is Canada to Mexico?

Canada was the source of approximately 1.1% of imports into Mexico in 2012. Approximately 5.8% of exports from Mexico were destined for Canada in that year.

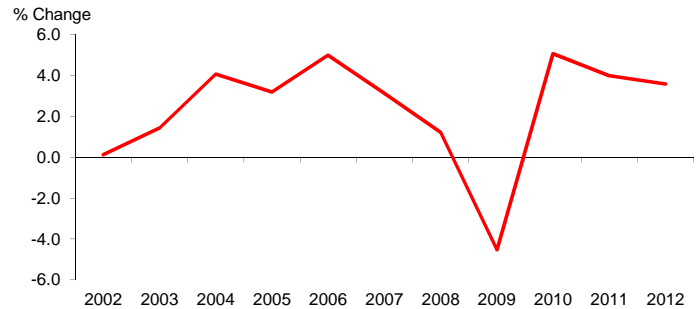

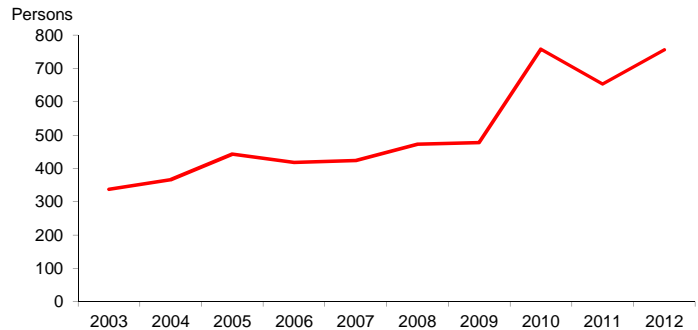
Year-Over-Year % Growth in GDP of Mexico

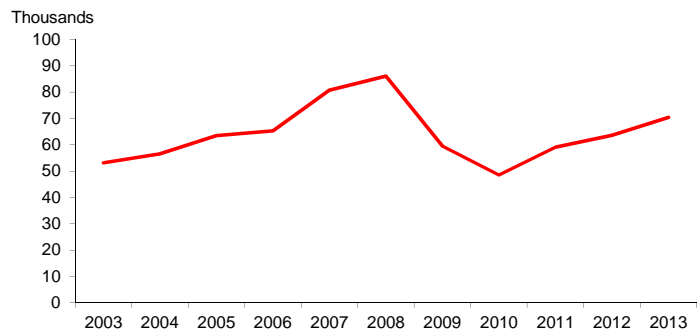
Immigrants to BC from Mexico
