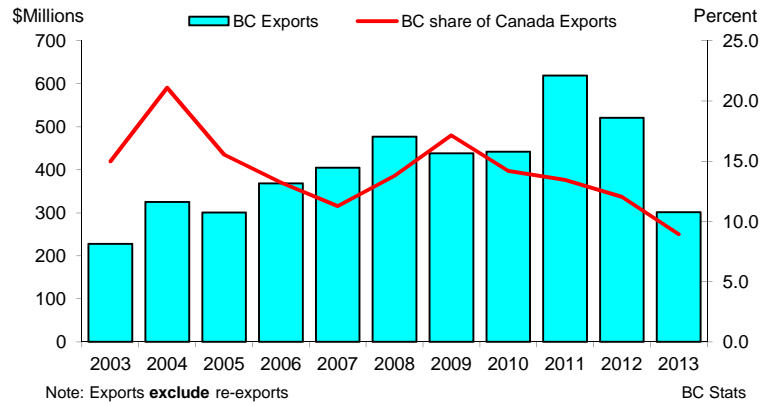

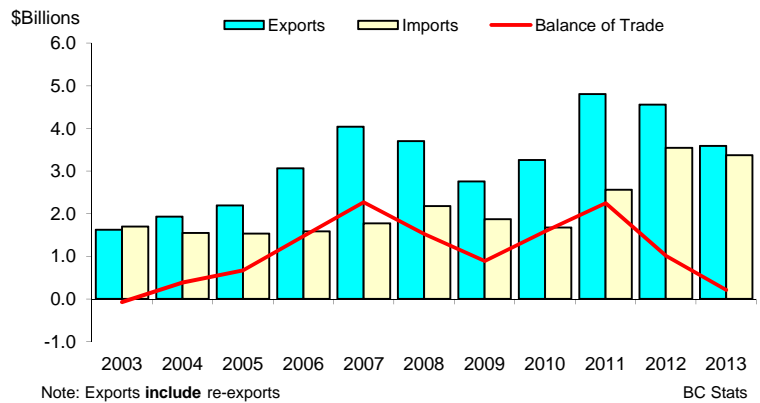
BC Origin Exports to Netherlands

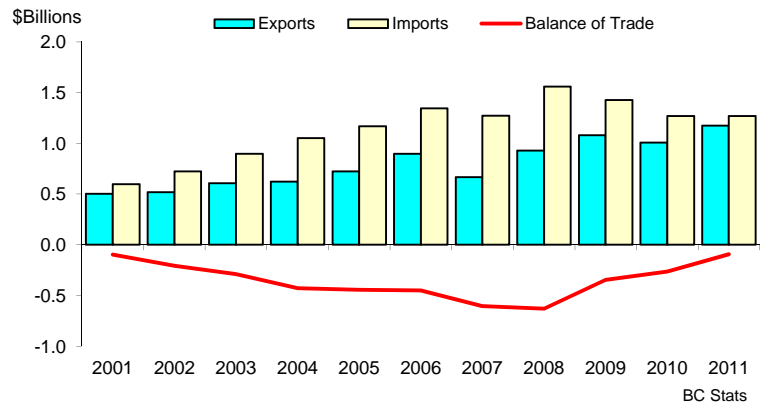
Canada's Balance of Trade in Goods with Netherlands

How important is Netherlands to BC and Canada?

Netherlands ranked #9 as a destination for BC origin exports in 2013 with 0.9% of BC's commodity exports shipped there. It was ranked #7 as a destination for Canadian exports with 0.8% of Canadian goods exports shipped there and #15 as a source of imports into Canada with 0.7% of Canadian imports originating from Netherlands.

How important is Canada to Netherlands?

Canada was the source of approximately 0.6% of imports into Netherlands in 2012. Approximately 0.3% of exports from Netherlands were destined for Canada in that year.

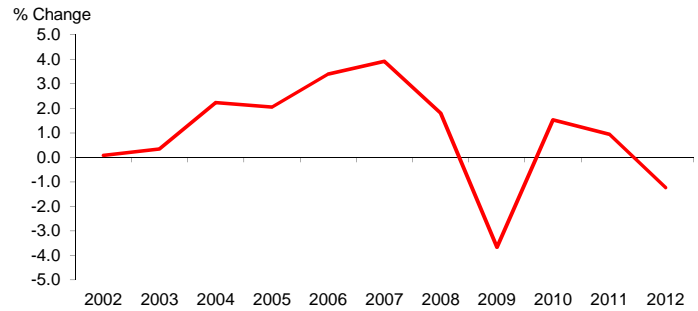

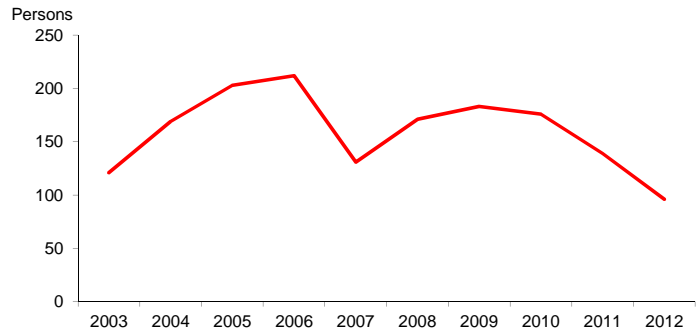
Year-Over-Year % Growth in GDP of Netherlands

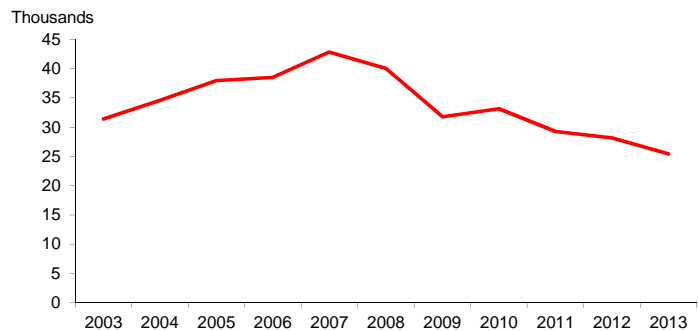
Immigrants to BC from Netherlands
