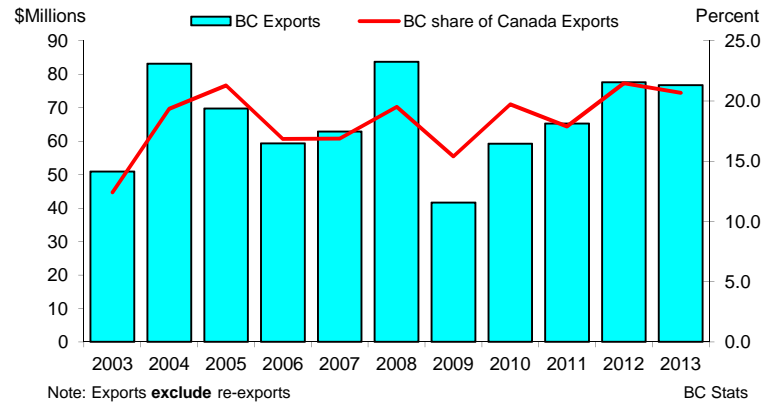

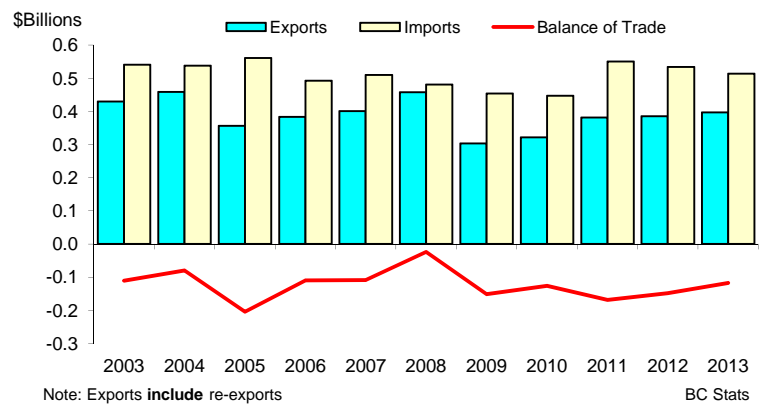

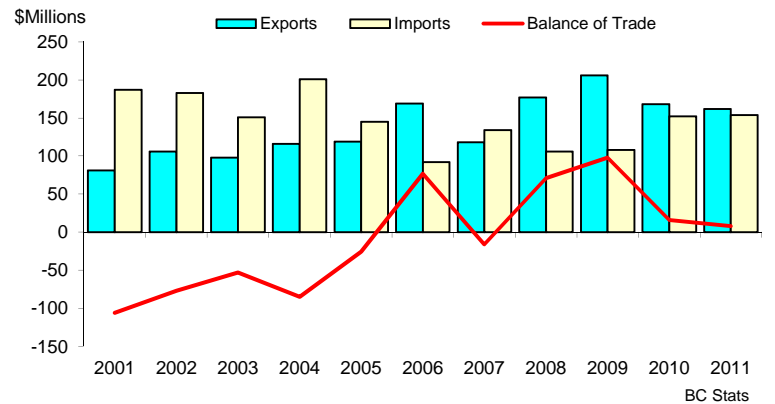
## BC Origin Exports to New Zealand

### How important is New Zealand to BC and Canada?

New Zealand ranked #22 as a destination for BC origin exports in 2013 with 0.2% of BC's commodity exports shipped there. It was ranked #43 as a destination for Canadian exports with 0.1% of Canadian goods exports shipped there and #51 as a source of imports into Canada with 0.1% of Canadian imports originating from New Zealand.

### How important is Canada to New Zealand?

Canada was the source of approximately 0.8% of imports into New Zealand in 2012. Approximately 1.2% of exports from New Zealand were destined for Canada in that year.

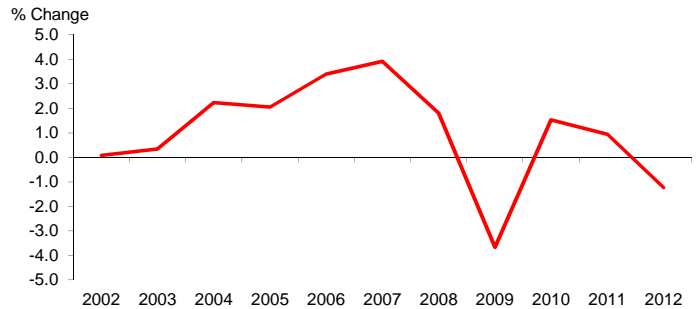

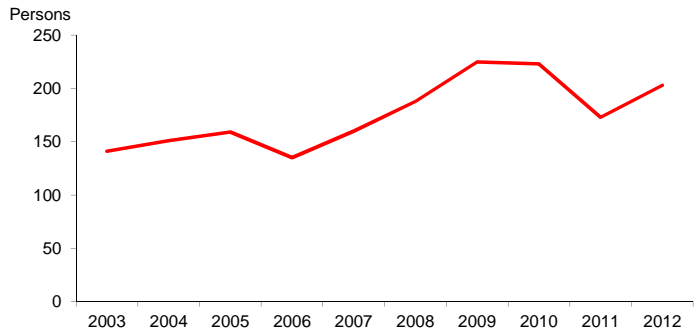
### Year-Over-Year % Growth in GDP of New Zealand

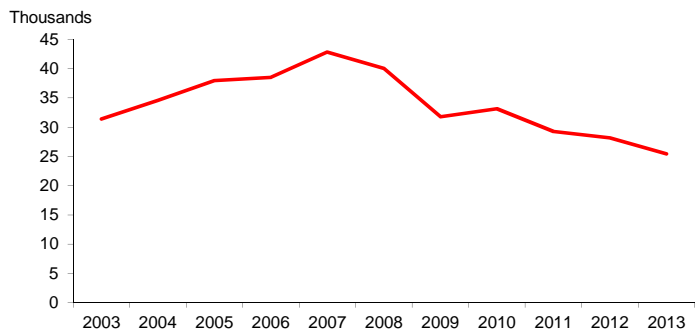
### Immigrants to BC from New Zealand
