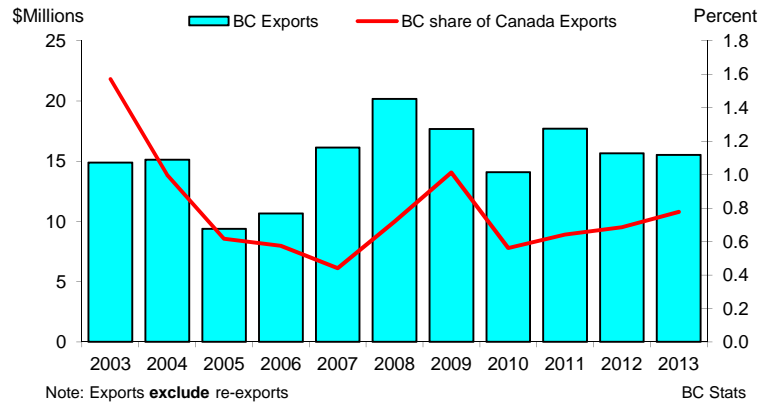

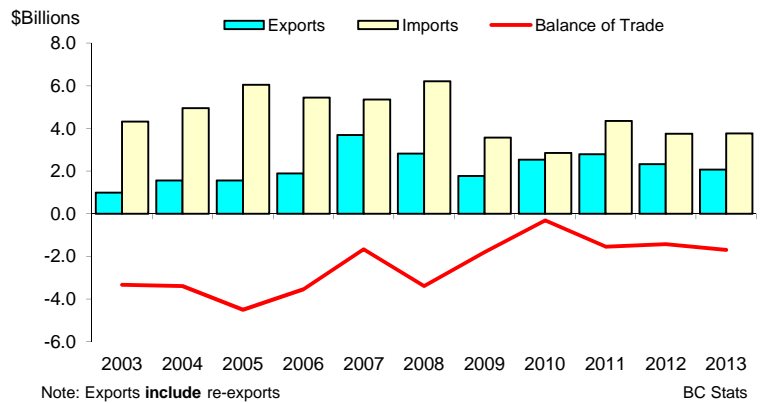
BC Origin Exports to Norway

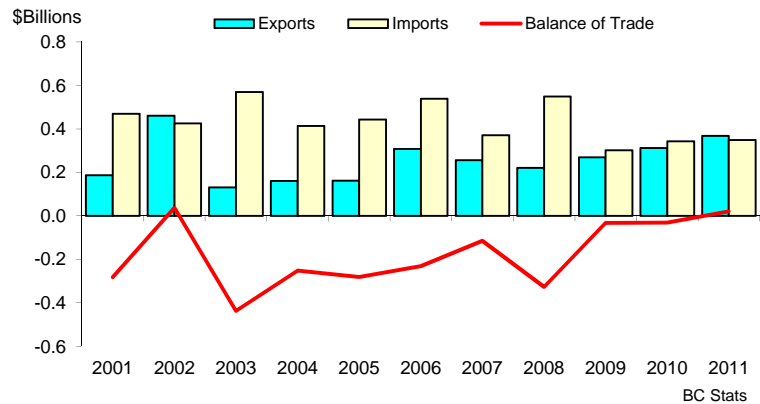
Canada's Balance of Trade in Goods with Norway

How important is Norway to BC and Canada?

Norway ranked #45 as a destination for BC origin exports in 2013 with 0.0% of BC's commodity exports shipped there. It was ranked #14 as a destination for Canadian exports with 0.5% of Canadian goods exports shipped there and #12 as a source of imports into Canada with 0.8% of Canadian imports originating from Norway.

How important is Canada to Norway?

Canada was the source of approximately 2.8% of imports into Norway in 2012. Approximately 1.7% of exports from Norway were destined for Canada in that year.

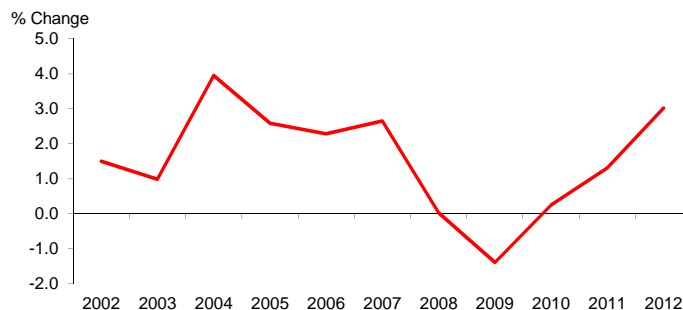

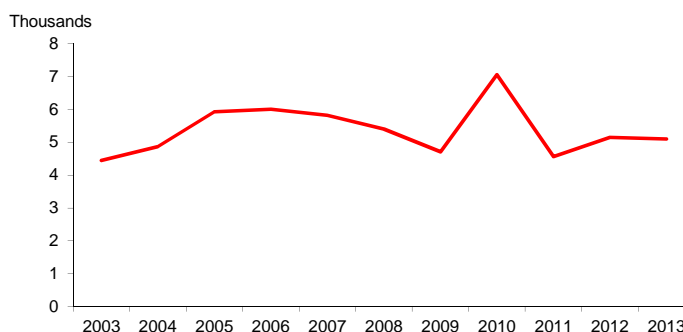
Immigrants to BC from Norway
