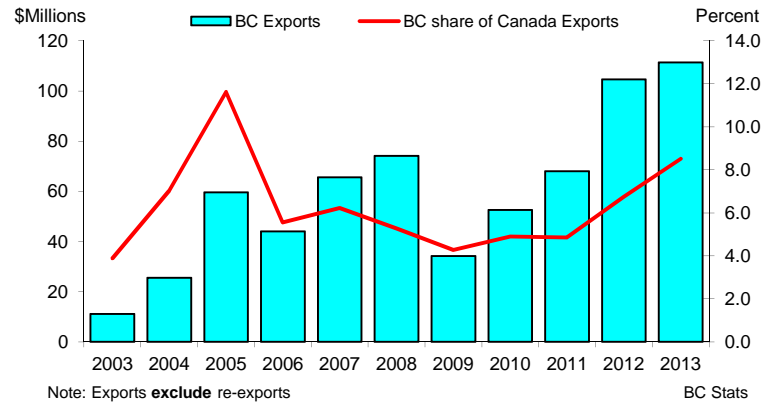

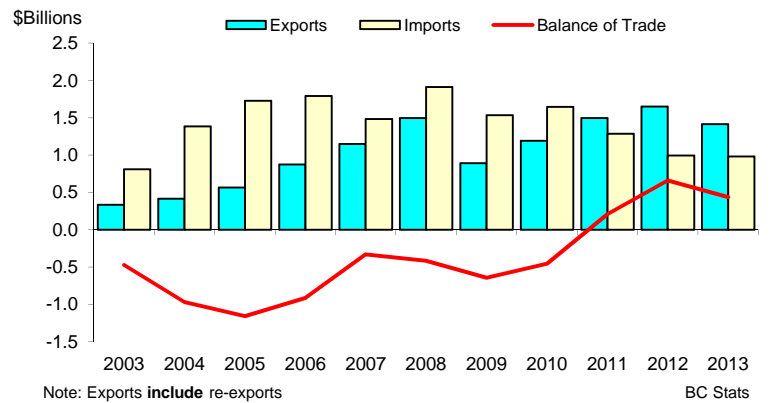

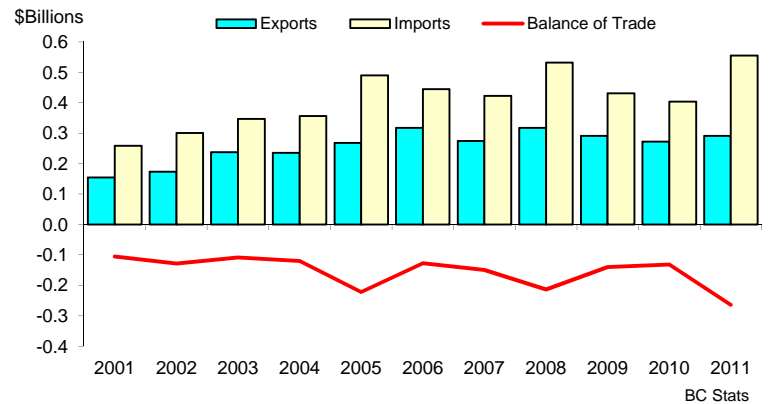
BC Origin Exports to Russia

How important is Russia to BC and Canada?

Russia ranked #18 as a destination for BC origin exports in 2013 with 0.3% of BC's commodity exports shipped there. It was ranked #21 as a destination for Canadian exports with 0.3% of Canadian goods exports shipped there and #45 as a source of imports into Canada with 0.2% of Canadian imports originating from Russia.

How important is Canada to Russia?

Canada was the source of approximately 0.3% of imports into Russia in 2012. Approximately 0.3% of exports from Russia were destined for Canada in that year.

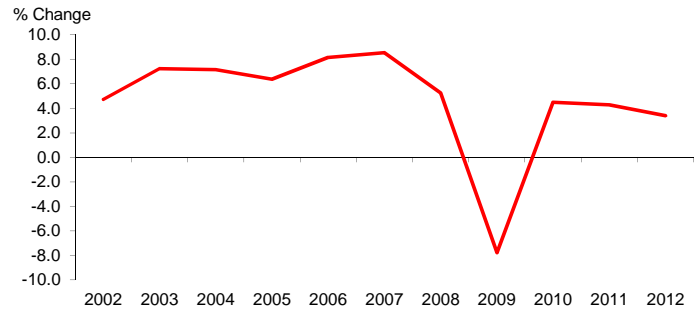

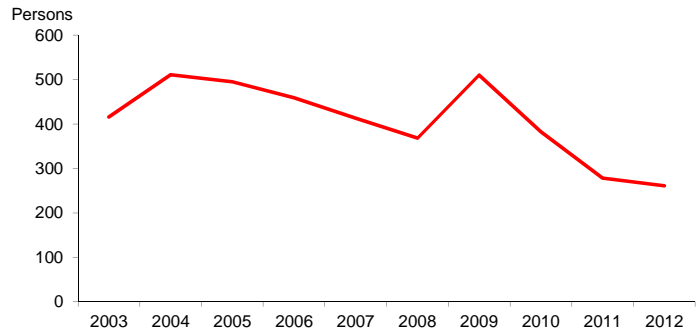
Year-Over-Year % Growth in GDP of Russia

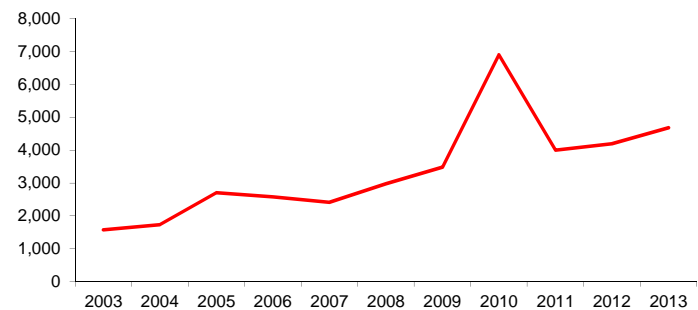
Immigrants to BC from Russia
