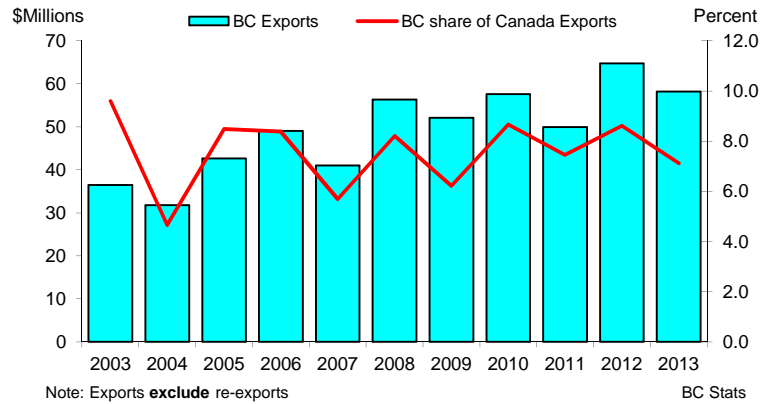

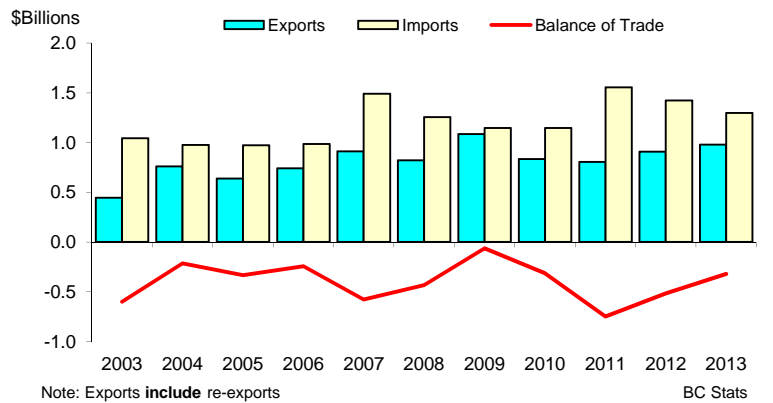

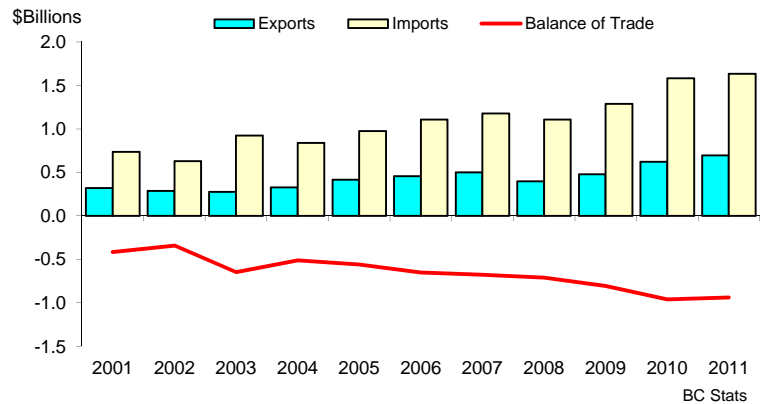
BC Origin Exports to Singapore

How important is Singapore to BC and Canada?

Singapore ranked #30 as a destination for BC origin exports in 2013 with 0.2% of BC's commodity exports shipped there. It was ranked #25 as a destination for Canadian exports with 0.2% of Canadian goods exports shipped there and #37 as a source of imports into Canada with 0.3% of Canadian imports originating from Singapore.

How important is Canada to Singapore?

Canada was the source of approximately 0.2% of imports into Singapore in 2012. Approximately 0.3% of exports from Singapore were destined for Canada in that year.

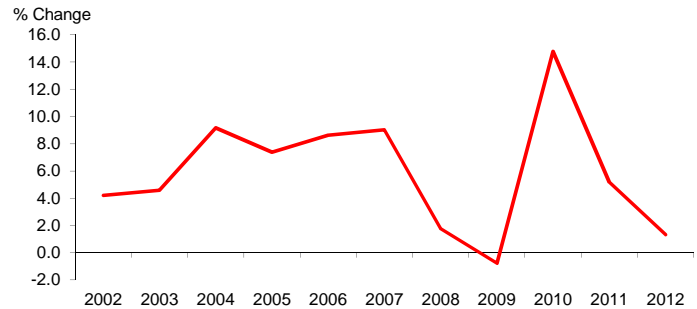

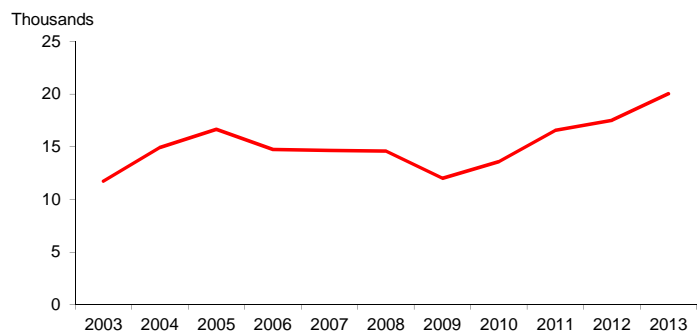
Immigrants to BC from Singapore
