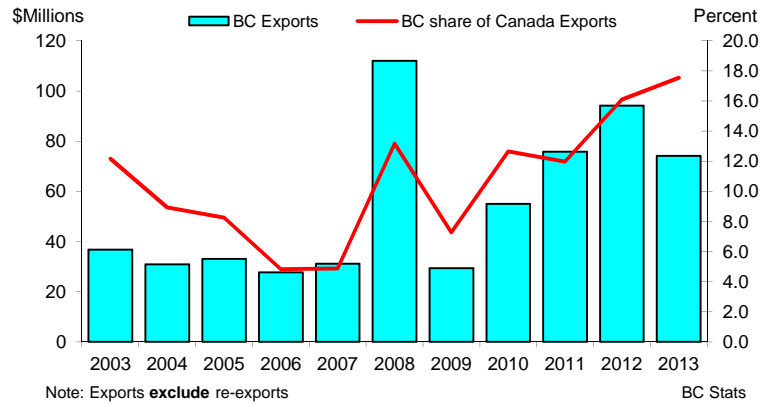

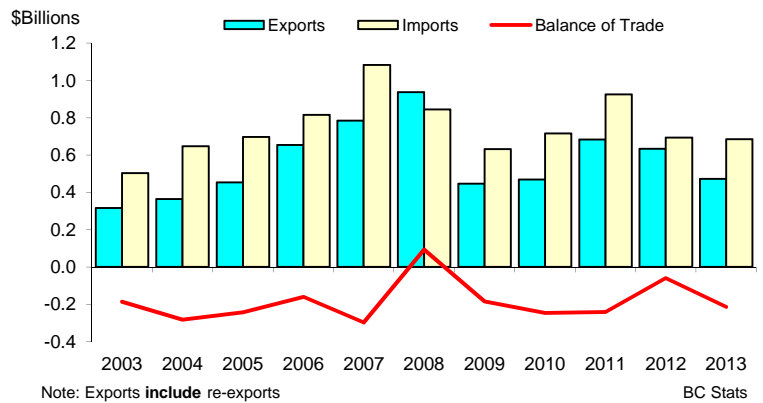

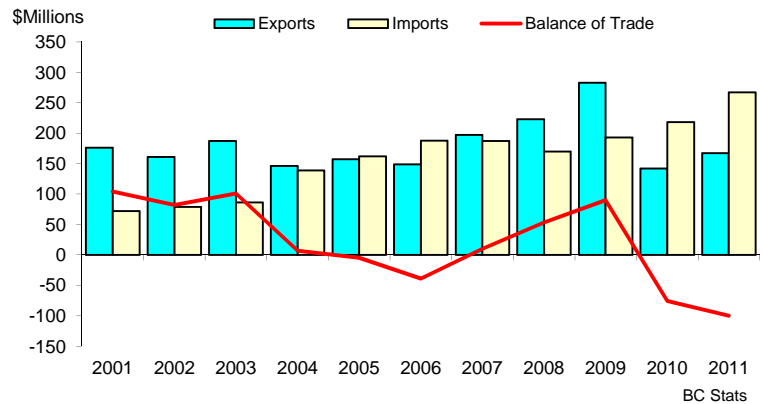
BC Origin Exports to South Africa

How important is South Africa to BC and Canada?

South Africa ranked #24 as a destination for BC origin exports in 2013 with 0.2% of BC's commodity exports shipped there. It was ranked #37 as a destination for Canadian exports with 0.1% of Canadian goods exports shipped there and #47 as a source of imports into Canada with 0.1% of Canadian imports originating from South Africa.

How important is Canada to South Africa?

Canada was the source of approximately 0.4% of imports into South Africa in 2012. Approximately 0.8% of exports from South Africa were destined for Canada in that year.

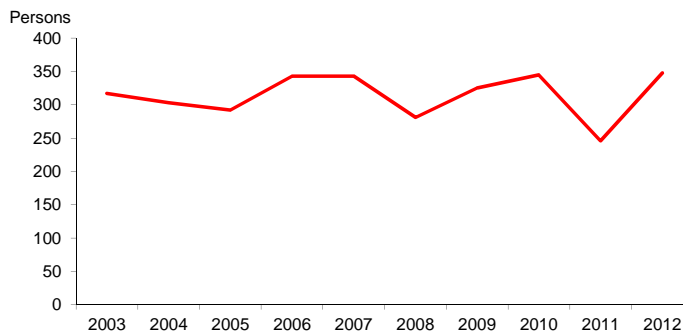
Year-Over-Year % Growth in GDP of South Africa

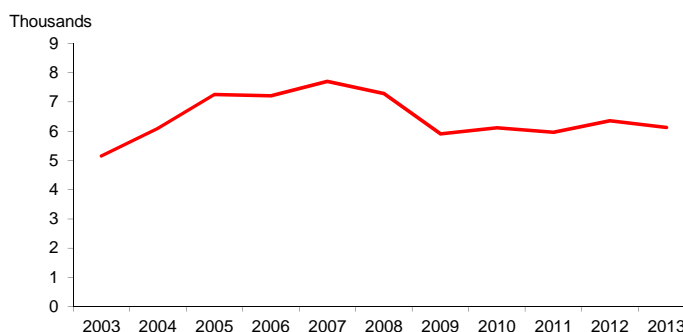
Immigrants to BC from South Africa
