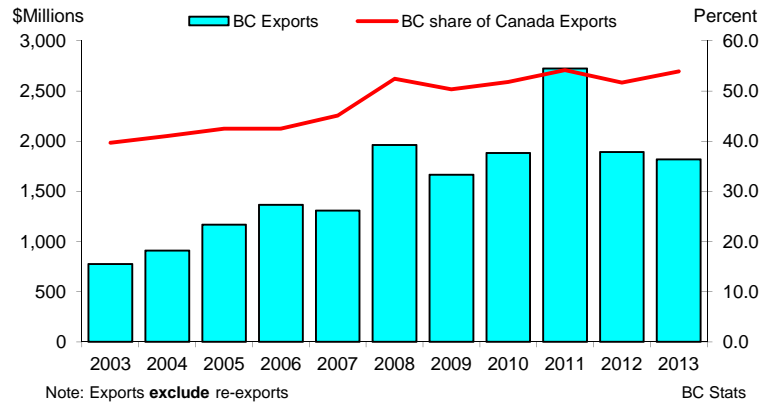

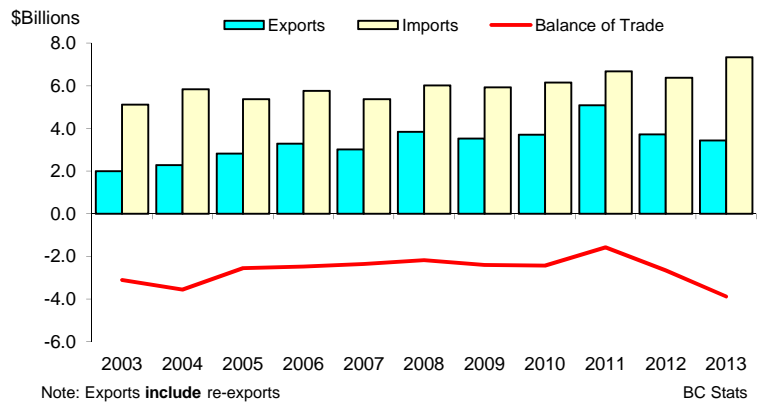
BC Origin Exports to South Korea

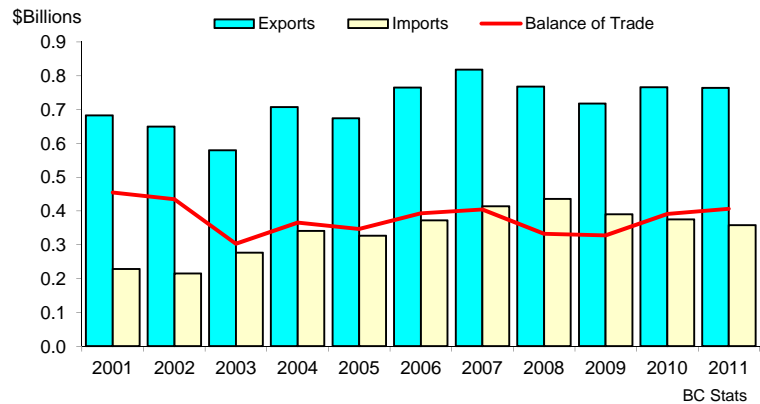
Canada's Balance of Trade in Goods with South Korea

How important is South Korea to BC and Canada?

South Korea ranked #4 as a destination for BC origin exports in 2013 with 5.4% of BC's commodity exports shipped there. It was ranked #8 as a destination for Canadian goods exports shipped there and #7 as a source of imports into Canada with 1.5% of Canadian imports originating from South Korea.

How important is Canada to South Korea?

Canada was the source of approximately 0.7% of imports into South Korea in 2012. Approximately 1.1% of exports from South Korea were destined for Canada in that year.

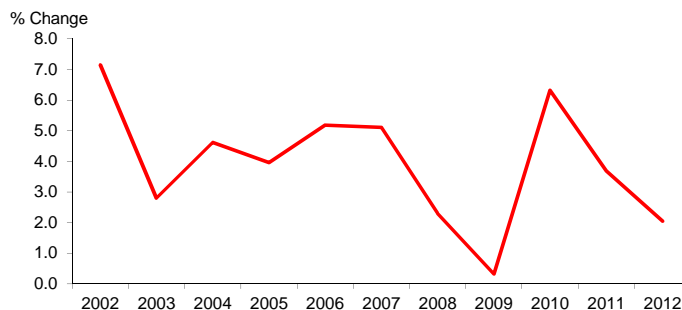

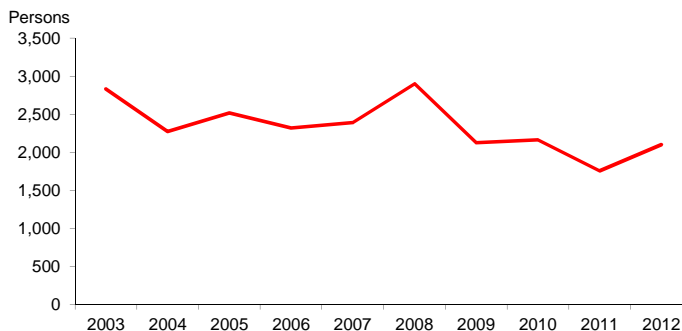
Year-Over-Year % Growth in GDP of South Korea

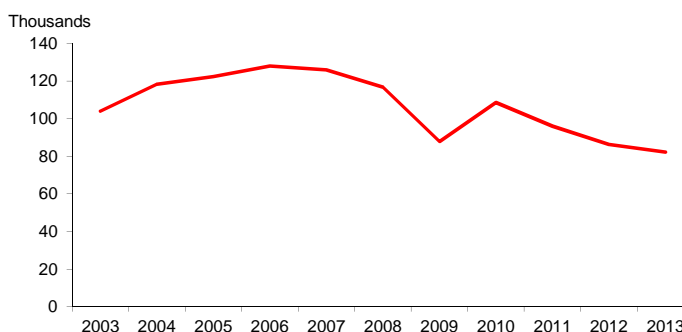
Immigrants to BC from South Korea
