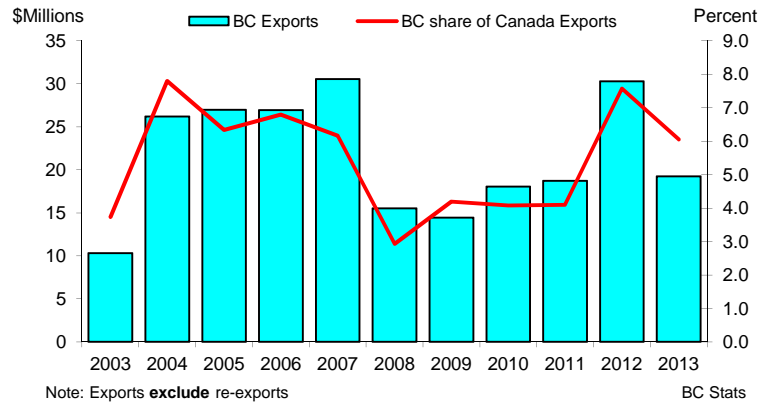

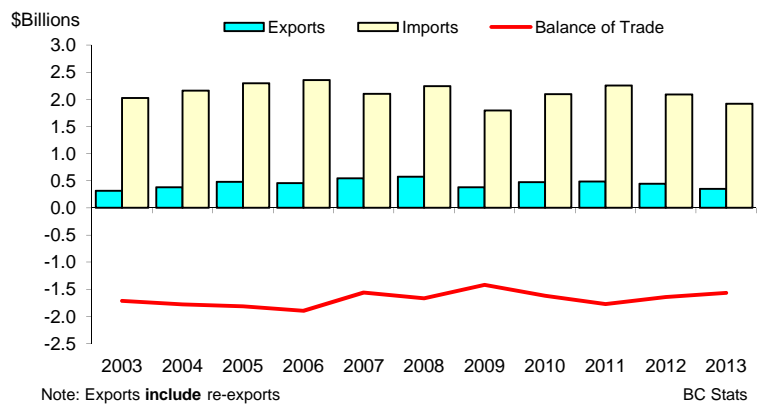

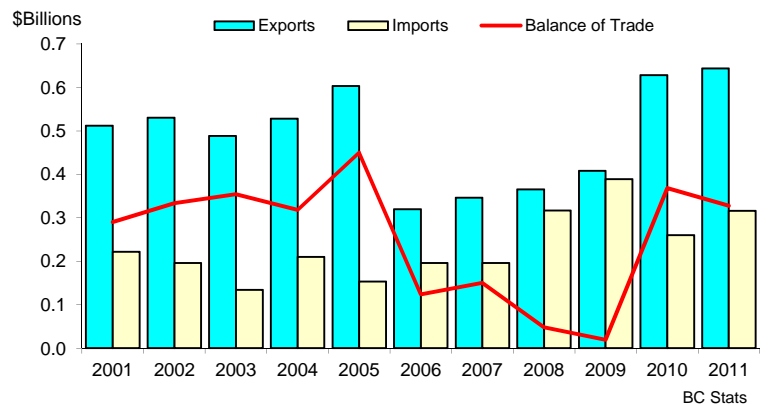
BC Origin Exports to Sweden

How important is Sweden to BC and Canada?

Sweden ranked #44 as a destination for BC origin exports in 2013 with 0.1% of BC's commodity exports shipped there. It was ranked #47 as a destination for Canadian exports with 0.1% of Canadian goods exports shipped there and #25 as a source of imports into Canada with 0.4% of Canadian imports originating from Sweden.

How important is Canada to Sweden?

Canada was the source of approximately 0.3% of imports into Sweden in 2012. Approximately 1.2% of exports from Sweden were destined for Canada in that year.

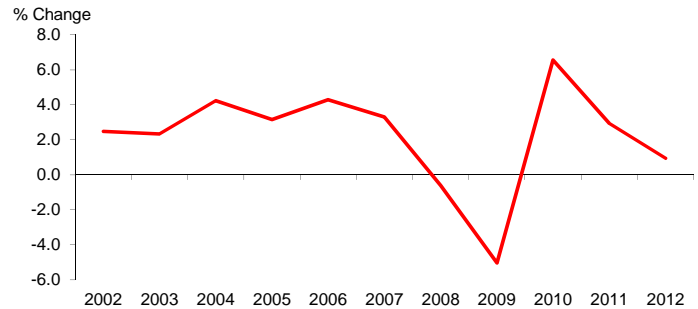

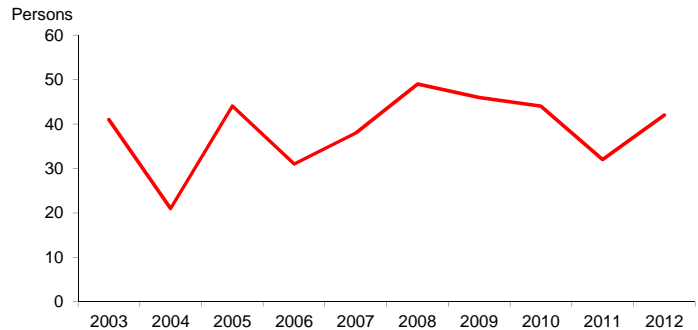
Year-Over-Year % Growth in GDP of Sweden

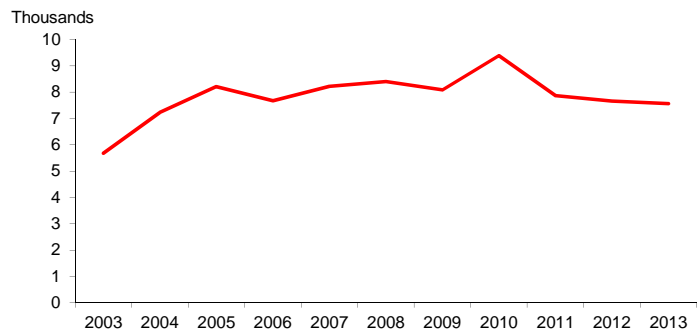
Immigrants to BC from Sweden
