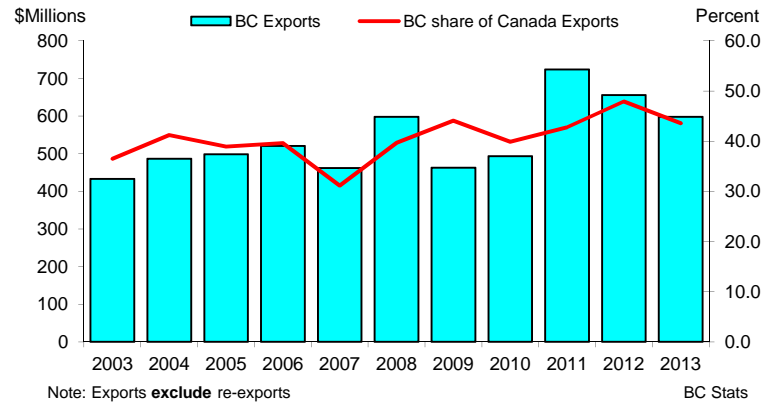

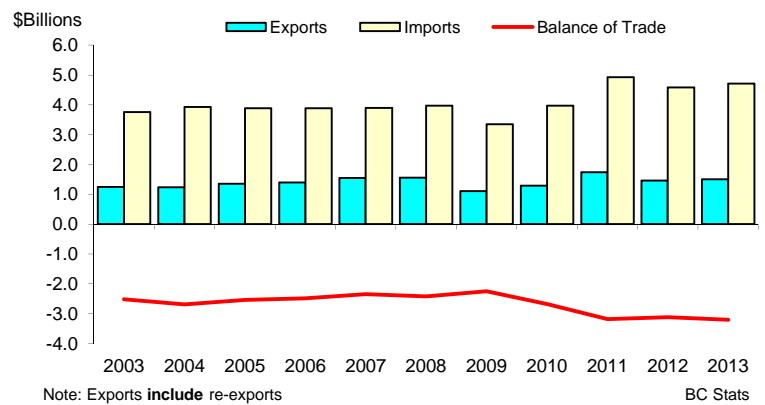

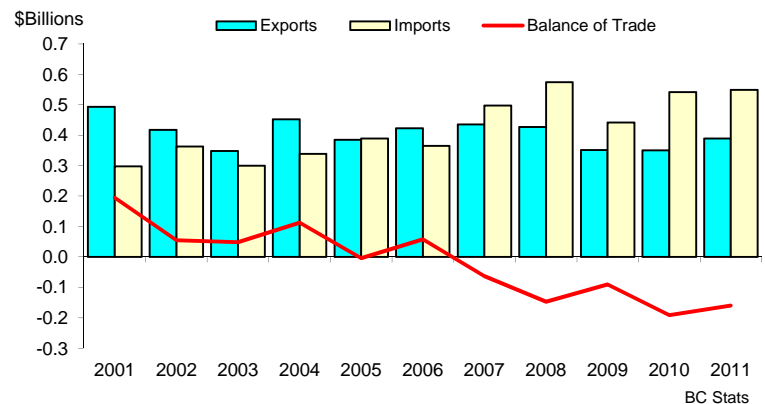
## BC Origin Exports to Taiwan

### How important is Taiwan to BC and Canada?

Taiwan ranked #5 as a destination for BC origin exports in 2013 with 1.8% of BC's commodity exports shipped there. It was ranked #20 as a destination for Canadian exports with 0.3% of Canadian goods exports shipped there and #10 as a source of imports into Canada with 1.0% of Canadian imports originating from Taiwan.

### How important is Canada to Taiwan?

Canada was the source of approximately 0.4% of imports into Taiwan in 2012. Approximately 1.3% of exports from Taiwan were destined for Canada in that year.

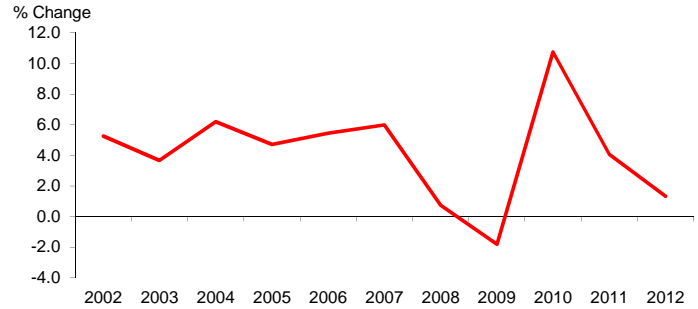

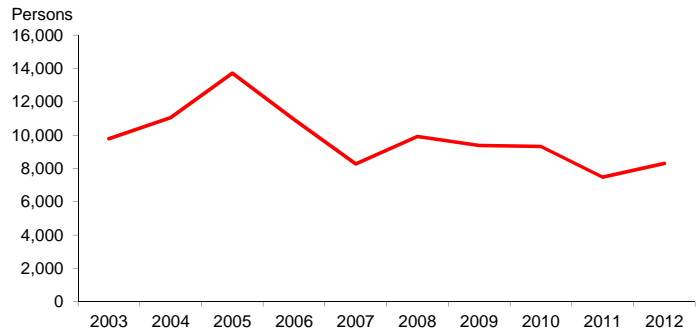
### Year-Over-Year % Growth in GDP of Taiwan

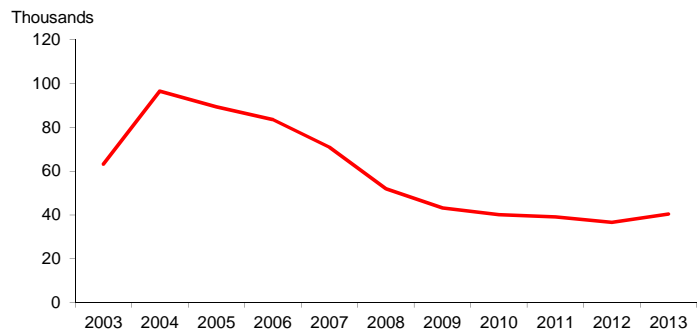
### Immigrants to BC from Taiwan
