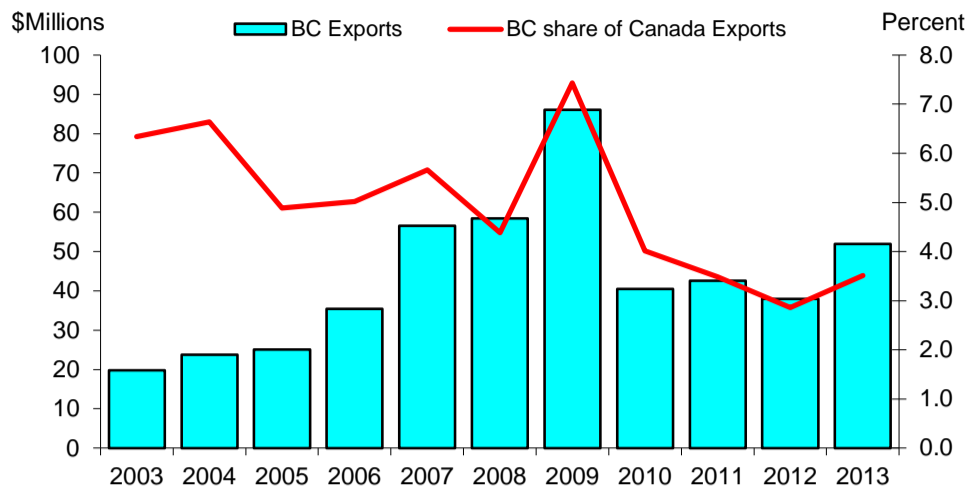

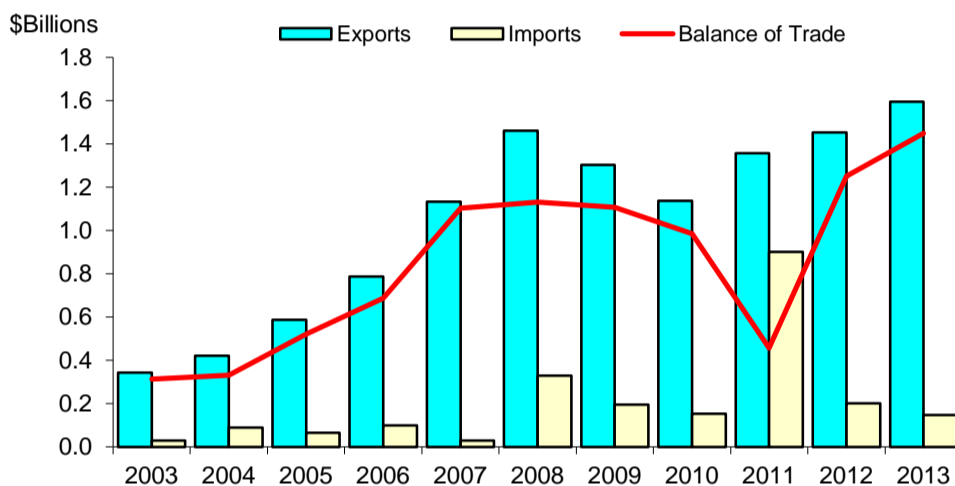
BC Origin Exports to United Arab Emirates

How important is United Arab Emirates to BC and Canada?

United Arab Emirates ranked #31 as a destination for BC origin exports in 2013 with 0.2% of BC's commodity exports shipped there. It was ranked #19 as a destination for Canadian exports with 0.3% of Canadian goods exports shipped there and #81 as a source of imports into Canada with 0.0% of Canadian imports originating from United Arab Emirates.

How important is Canada to United Arab Emirates?

Canada was the source of approximately 0.5% of imports into United Arab Emirates in 2012. Approximately 0.1% of exports from United Arab Emirates were destined for Canada in that year.

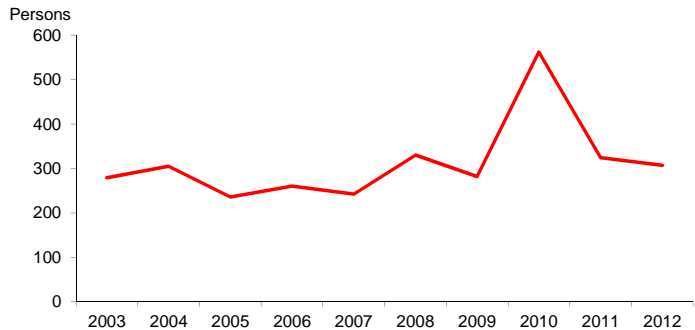
Year-Over-Year % Growth in GDP of United Arab Emirates

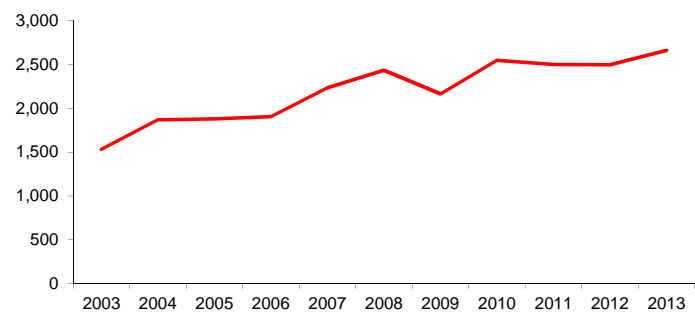
Immigrants to BC from United Arab Emirates
