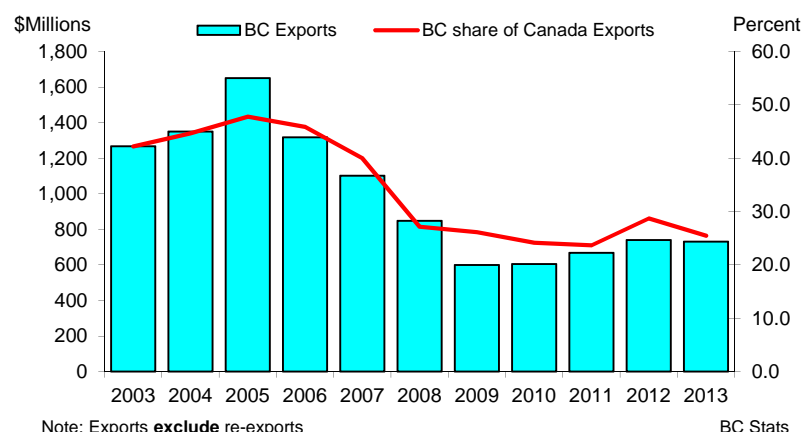

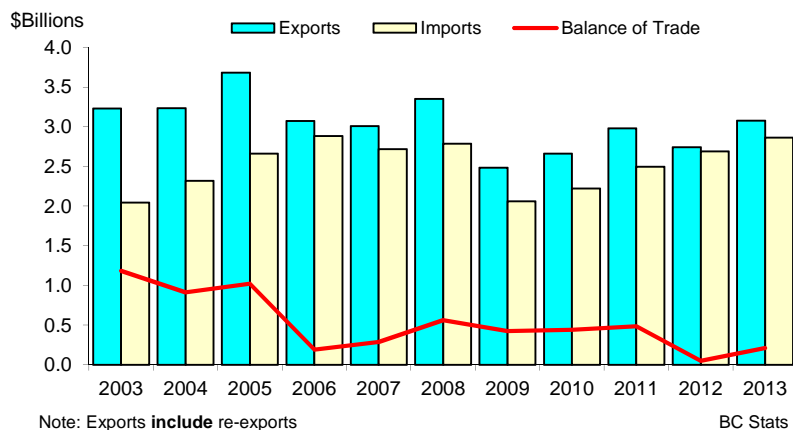

How does Oregon compare with other US states?

Among the states, Oregon ranked #5 as a destination for BC Exports and #27 as a destination for Canadian Exports. As a source of imports to Canada, it ranked #25 among the states.

How important is Oregon to BC and Canada?

If Oregon were a separate country, it would rank #5 as a destination for BC origin exports in 2013 with 2.2% of BC's commodity exports shipped there. It would be ranked #10 as a destination for Canadian exports with 0.6% of Canadian goods exports shipped there and #20 as a source of imports into Canada with 0.6% of Canadian imports originating from Oregon.

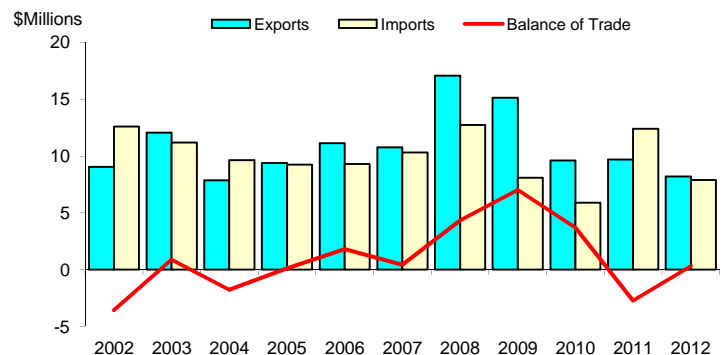
Year-Over-Year % Growth in GDP of Oregon
