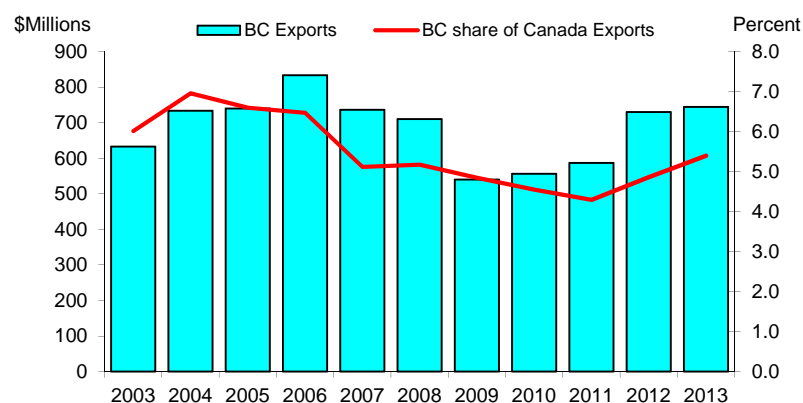

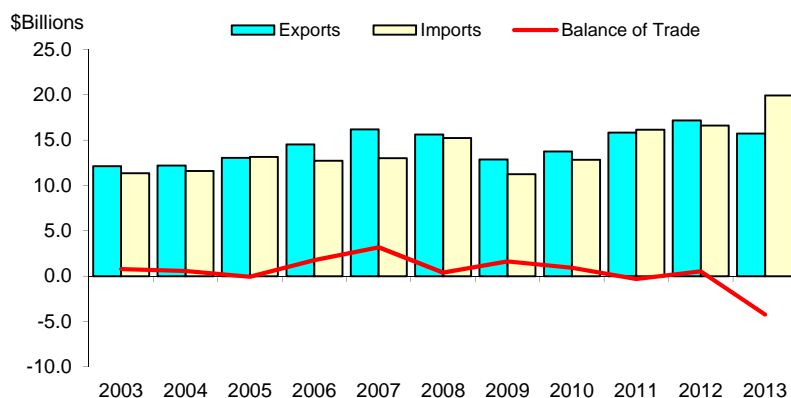
## BC Origin Exports to Texas

### How does Texas compare with other US states?

Among the states, Texas ranked #4 as a destination for BC Exports and #8 as a destination for Canadian Exports. As a source of imports to Canada, it ranked #2 among the states.

### How important is Texas to BC and Canada?

If Texas were a separate country, it would rank #5 as a destination for BC origin exports in 2013 with 2.2% of BC's commodity exports shipped there. It would be ranked #3 as a destination for Canadian exports with 3.1% of Canadian goods exports shipped there and #4 as a source of imports into Canada with 4.2% of Canadian imports originating from Texas.

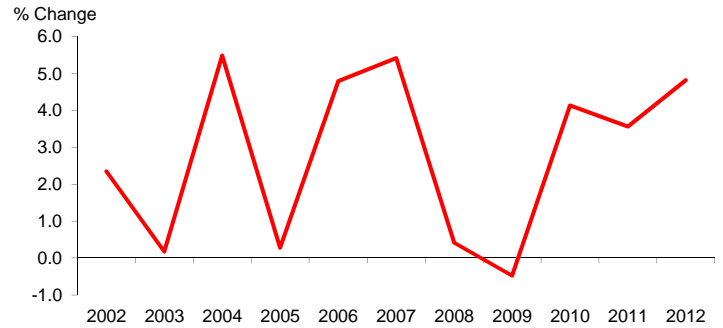

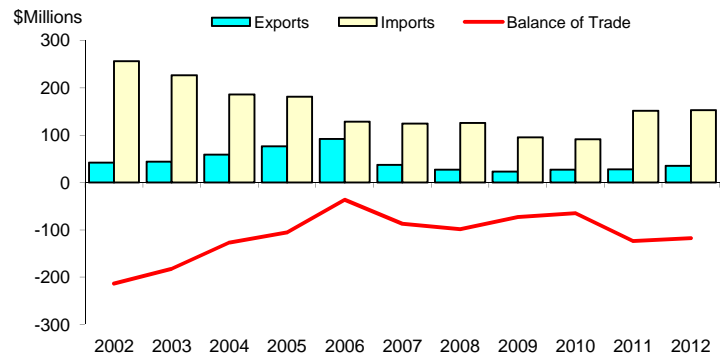
### Year-Over-Year % Growth in GDP of Texas
