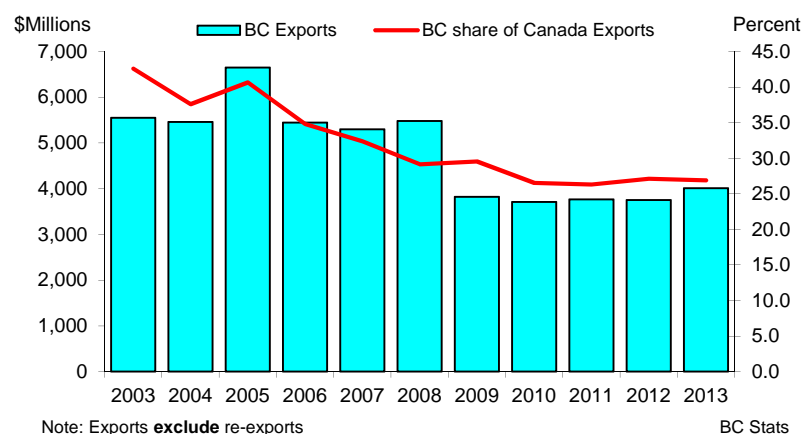

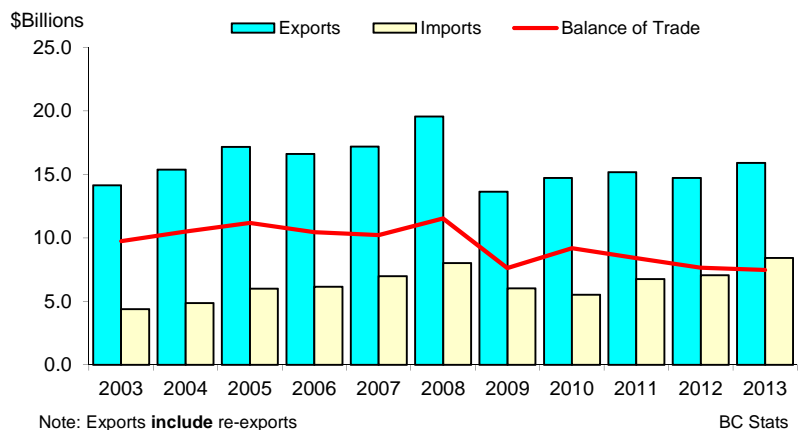

How does Washington compare with other US states?

Among the states, Washington ranked #1 as a destination for BC Exports and #6 as a destination for Canadian Exports. As a source of imports to Canada, it ranked #9 among the states.

How important is Washington to BC and Canada?

If Washington were a separate country, it would rank #4 as a destination for BC origin exports in 2013 with 11.9% of BC's commodity exports shipped there. It would be ranked #3 as a destination for Canadian exports with 3.4% of Canadian goods exports shipped there and #6 as a source of imports into Canada with 1.8% of Canadian imports originating from Washington.

Washington Travel to Canada

There were 1,296,000 trips made by residents of Washington to Canada in 2012 and they spent \$Cdn 505 million while visiting. Washington ranked #2 among the states in terms of the number of residents making trips to Canada.

Canadian Travel to Washington

The number of trips by Canadians to Washington in 2012 was 2,933,000. The total amount spent on those trips was \$Cdn 853 million. Washington ranked #3 among the states as a destination for Canadian travellers.

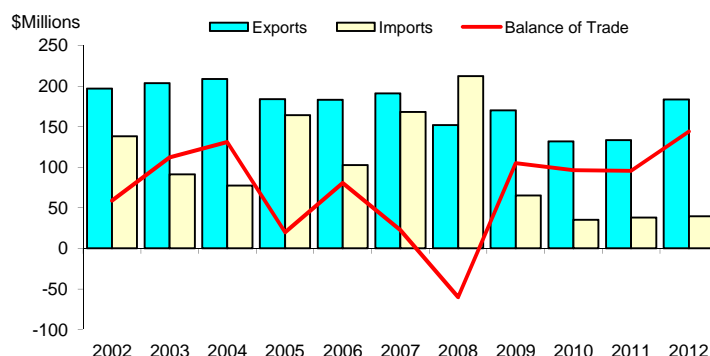
Year-Over-Year % Growth in GDP of Washington
