NOTES

1. Party affiliation is given from the 12th parliament onwards, when party government came into existence.
2. Noted dates indicate the year in which the Deputy Speaker was appointed by the Legislative Assembly. During the period 1893-4 when the appointment of the Deputy Speaker was on a day-to-day basis, the specific dates and individuals involved as movers and seconders have been noted.
3. When more than one session was held in a calendar year, the date noted is accompanied by a "1" or "2" to indicate the existence of the additional session.
4. Years denote sessions actually attended as Deputy Speaker. Deputy speakers were not appointed regularly until
5. The position of Assistant Deputy Speaker was created during the 38th Parliament (2005).
